Through out the Catholic Church the three Sundays leading to Easter will be dedicated to the intensive preparation of the Catechumens who are either to be baptized or to be received into full communion with the Catholic Church during Easter. Liturgical ceremonies will be done step by step. The Church asks her children already baptized to accompany the catechumens with prayer on their journey of faith.

The Rite of Election took place at St. Chad's Cathedral on Feb. 21st during which the Archbishop accepted them to be received into the Catholic Church. What will follow in the three scrutinies is to integrate the catechumens into the local parish communities as they make the profession of faith.

At the 9:30am Holy Mass, the catechumens will be presented with the Creed. In other words we shall make a profession of our faith in their hearing. It is the faith of the Church which they wish to enter into full communion with. They will be asked to listen carefully to the words of that faith by which they will be justified. The words are few but the mysteries they contain are great. They will be asked to "receive them with sincere heart and to be faithful to them."

St. Mary's is blessed to have 10 catechumens this year. It is a sign that the parish is alive and active. It is also a sign that you the parishioners are doing your best to put into your daily life the teaching of Christ. This has inspired other people to desire becoming his followers. For all these, let us thank the Lord.

**Fourth Sunday of Lent

Mothering Sunday is here again; a moment when we reflect on the dignity of motherhood. As Christians, this time is calling us to return either physically, in prayer or in thought to those churches where we were claimed for Christ through baptism. A mother is a giver of life and she holds a special place in ordinary existence of mankind; so with the church. It is the church that gave us life in Christ. A tradition that goes centuries far back reveals that Christians have always appreciated the spiritual motherhood of the church on this Sunday. It is the Church that will always receive us and commend our souls into the open arms of God's mercy.

The Holy Bible reminds us that Israel of old remembered Zion as the mother of all peoples. It was on Mt. Zion that Jerusalem and the temple of Yahweh were built. From here the inhabitants drew nourishment, protection, justice and knowledge of God.

“On the Holy Mountain is his city loved by the Lord, the Lord prefers the gates of Zion, to all Jacob's dwellings, of you are told glorious things O City of God! Babylon, Egypt I will count among those who know me. Philistia, Tyre, Ethiopia, these will be her children, and Zion shall be called “Mother” for all shall be her children... In his register of people's he writes; ‘these are all her children’ and while they dance they will sing; in you all find their home” Ps. 86.

How fitting these words are in the life of our parish on this Mothering Sunday! Although we're from many parts of the world, we're united under the Spiritual Motherhood of St. Mary's Church! It doesn't matter when, where or who baptized you, our faith and the Church have made us all children of God. Dear Parishioners,

World Day of Prayer for Vocations April 25th 2010..

Next Sunday we shall celebrate the World Day of Prayer for Vocations. Why should we pray for vocations? Well Jesus asked us to pray for vocations.

"After this Jesus sent out 72 others ahead of him in towns and villages he wanted to visit. He said to them 'the harvest is rich but the laborers are few, so ask the Lord of the harvest to send workers into his harvest' Lk. 10: 2.

The crisis of vocations concerns us all. We need priests, we need religious people and we need lay men and women who can go ahead of the Lord. It is not so much the numbers that the church needs; but holy priests and holy religious men and women, not mere social workers. We therefore pray for holiness of life in all those who are called to this ministry.

Vocations in the church will prosper if every Christian employs a personal friendship with Jesus Christ. It is our relationship with him that sustains us. The witness we give as Christians to young people in our families, in the schools and in the church will either point them to Christ in the service of the Church or will deter them from following him.

All Christians are responsible for the promotion of vocations in the Church; but in my own experience, this duty rests more especially on the parents in the home. We never fall in love with strangers; so with vocations, children are less likely to follow Jesus in the priesthood or religious life if they have never heard their parents talk about it to them. Probably we need to ask ourselves: 'how often do I talk to others about vocations!'

I wish you every blessing as we pray for vocations next Sunday. Please young people feel free to speak to me about this important subject.

On May 6th, the people of United Kingdom will go to the polls to choose new leaders of the country. There is no doubt that many Christians will turn up on the material day to cast their vote. Some however might not feel interested to turn up either because they are disillusioned by politicians, or take politics to be a worldly dirty game.

But look at it this way: during the past weeks of campaigning politicians have presented their manifestos which revealed their policies in case they came into Office No. 10. Do you agree with whatever has been said? Do the policies promote basic human rights and values? A Christian cannot ignore these policies without giving them a second thought. For that reason turning up to vote on May 6th becomes a Christian Duty.

The Bishops Conference of England and Wales has established a Website link which parishioners might find helpful to consider when you are approached by parliamentary aspirants. While choosing our leaders (voting) is a Christian duty and a civil right, there are some points which you might need to consider as a Christian and which you would possibly like to know what opinion the candidate has about them. Thank God the campaigns are over; we can sit back and listen to something else other than politics. I followed the campaigns closely not because I'm interested in politics but as a pastor of God's people, it is necessary to keep watch on the menu that the flock is fed on. From a pastoral and Christian perspective there are some interesting observations I made. I noticed for example how easy it is to blame others for the failures! No doubt others might make things difficult but to blame ones' defeat on others is to admit that we are not big enough to overcome the obstacles that are in the way. When the expert misses the mark he looks for the fault within himself. Failure to reach the goal is not so much the fault of something beyond ourselves as of something within ourselves.

A good number things are blamed on the Church these days even by Christians. There are many things that need a new approach, but to improve them, individual Christians ought to overcome the crisis of faith within. Let us aim at improving our personal relationship with Jesus as members of his body – the church.

Can we succeed? Yes but only if we overcome the daily difficulties of our faith and not be overcome by them. We must never fall away from Jesus or from his Church. Remember always that obstacles are only a challenge to a person determined to win, for someone not determined to win, he never meets obstacles. Of many a situation it has been said "It can't be done" but of every achievement made against odds it has always been said; "It couldn't be done, but somehow it was done." It is when we remain firm in our Christian calling against all difficulties that we prove our Love for Christ.

SOLEMNITY OF THE MOST HOLY TRINITY:

What is your god doing; is he watching you or is he watching over you? Nowadays thanks to the security camera we are often being watched, watched by a cold dispassionate eye, intent only on catching us in wrong doing. The feeling that someone is watching us is not a pleasant one. But the feeling that someone is watching over us, is a welcome feeling. God is not watching us, He is watching over us. This conviction gives us comfort in times of sadness, strength in times of weakness and hope in times of despair.

What concept of God do you have? For some people, God remains as he was for the primitive man – a jealous, revengeful being, favoring some, destroying others. He's not that! He is a God who demands justice and righteousness from us all. There are people who cherish an archaic idea of a nationalistic local or ethnic deity who must favor their ethnic aspirations instead of regarding God as a compassionate Father of all creatures. Christian revelation teaches us that God destroys none nor favors one against the other, all are his children, he gives and demands love from all as a dad does from his children.

It makes a difference in our behavior how we think about God. Someone whose God is too small, will be inadequate to the demands of life and faith. He will see God as open to some but must be closed to others. Growing in the knowledge and love of God is a constant duty of every Christian. Faith is like an airplane, when it stops, it falls. When we stagnate in our love of God we fall too.

**SOLEMNITY OF THE MOST HOLY TRINITY:**

What is your god doing; is he watching you or is he watching over you? Nowadays thanks to the security camera we are often being watched, watched by a cold dispassionate eye, intent only on catching us in wrong doing. The feeling that someone is watching us is not a pleasant one. But the feeling that someone is watching over us, is a welcome feeling. God is not watching us, He is watching over us. This conviction gives us comfort in times of sadness, strength in times of weakness and hope in times of despair.

What concept of God do you have? For some people, God remains as he was for the primitive man – a jealous, revengeful being, favoring some, destroying others. He's not that! He is a God who demands justice and righteousness from us all. Dear Parishioners, Have you accumulated enough evidence to convict you? Here at my holiday I attended a court hearing at which I was one of the judges. There were lots of accusations and counter accusations that it was difficult to find out fiction from fact. Nevertheless as a judge it was my duty to conduct a fair trial, give each party a hearing, and pass sentence based on the evidence that could not be disputed.

In the course of the trial, some persons shed tears, others raised their voices pointing fingers and some cursed heaven while still some claimed innocence. Yet no behavior could attract my undue sympathy or derail my procedure, all I wanted was evidence which could be used either to convict or to free someone. Something struck my heart. Imagine this trial was being conducted to prove my being a faithful follower of Jesus Christ, would I have enough evidence to convict me as a Christian! This question is very deep; the answer can be given individually and personally. Being a Christian goes beyond appearing in the company of Christians or fulfilling the letters of Christian laws.

I believe that unless we become staunch Christians to a degree that nobody can prove the contrary we shall not produce enough evidence to qualify us for heaven as followers of Christ. Lukewarm Christianity and merely external religiosity must be avoided.

At the end of the trial, I dismissed the accused for lack of sufficient evidence, yet that did not mean that he was entirely innocent!

Dear Parishioners,

I am already on the last phase of my holidays and very soon I'll be with you to celebrate the feast of St. Benedict, the patron of our parish.

St Benedict is known as the patriarch of Western Monasticism. He was born about 480AD and died in 547. At that time, the Goths set up a kingdom in Italy and were striving to defend it when at the age of 14 the young Benedict went to Rome to complete his education.

He fled Rome convinced that God was calling him to be a monk or hermit. Upon receiving his monastic uniform, he underwent 3 years probation of silence, penance and prayer at Subiaco. He built 12 monasteries for postulants, Goth and nobles who wished to share his way of life.

Benedict established the famous Abbey at Monte Casino where he spent the rest of his life and wrote a Rule of Life which has dominated Western religious life for 600 years. It is a remarkable document, rigidly Roman in style emphasizing the virtues of obedience and humility.

St. Benedict was buried at Monte Casino in the same grave as his sister St. Scholastica. The feast of St. Benedict was in earlier times celebrated on March 21st the date of his death but it was changed to July 11th. He is remembered especially for his famous motto "Ora et Labora" = Pray and work. Indeed every religious person you meet today no matter which part of the world he/she comes from, has something of St. Benedict in him/her. Let us try to imitate his motto as we strive to build our school and parish communities.

Repairing our severely damaged Flat Roof

I must have mentioned to you in the course of the year that the flat roof of our church property right from the garage to the convent is leaking. You must have noticed basins and buckets in various corners whenever it rained. Well the situation needs to be rectified possibly before we get a severe weather again. I had several ideas including putting a pitched roof on the convent, the hall and the alleyway but this will be too expensive. It has been suggested that an improved flat roof be established instead, which will include an introduction on 8mm insulation material to meet the building regulations.

Various roofing material manufacturers and contractors have visited the project and given their suggestions. These have in turn been presented to the diocesan treasury for further study.

This project worthwhile as it will plunge the parish into a huge financial debt! We had borrowed £70,000 to pay for the works that had been initiated by my predecessor. Thank you all for working hard until now we have managed to reduce it to £21000 which is outstanding. Since the parish has no money to repair the flat roof, we are going to borrow again. The longer this work is postponed the worse it gets, we have no option but to come together and see what we can do for our parish.

Although this work would have started earlier, I did not want it to be carried on during my absence for reasons you can guess. It is my wish that the work starts as soon as possible once the deal is sealed. Our help is in the name of the Lord.

Dear parishioners, I'm very grateful to you all who turned up last Monday in the hall to advise me on the work of repairing the flat roof. Please thank you for your time and for the advice you gave.

The building regulations require putting insulation boards facilities on the roof in order to improve its thermal performance. The roofing material we intend to use is known as Resitrix SK self adhesive EPDM weatherproofing system complete with a 15 year manufacturers guarantee. You must be aware that over the years the flat roof has been leaking right from the Convent, the parish hall, the corridor until the garage. The scaffolding can give you the extent of the work being undertaken. Taking into account the damage, it was not wise to make patches, but to put a new overlay. This job leaves us with a big debt to pay but we should not be afraid because God is here among us and with us building his church.

I don't want to saddle you with greater financial burdens than you already have; however we have to work on the parish debt for the works undertaken. I'm suspending voluntary second collections in the church and proposing a second collection for the parish once every month to help us pay off our debts. As a matter of fact the parish has no collection for its own projects. The initial second collection for our church will be on Sunday Oct. 17th. Try to think of some other areas you can support the church; e.g. more generosity in your donation to the church every Sunday, Tithe that is giving 10% of your income to God's work, being parsimonious in shopping – if you don't really need it, don't buy it; joining family draw, bonus ball and renting our hall among others.

Dear Parishioners,

I was thinking about the big debt which the roof repair will leave behind. ### **What could it be but the Hand of God!**

This week saw the dramatic rescue of 33 miners buried half mile below the Chilean rocks of Copiapo; their survival and coming to surface brought relief even to us here thousands of miles away. But things do not simply happen without purpose. Even though the explanation of events might be hidden, some events reveal a God who wants people to draw meaning in events so that they can acknowledge him.

How could these men survive the first 17 days when they knew that surely one-by-one, death was their fate! From their evidence what kept them alive was their faith in God and the hope that possibly the next minute would bring good news. If anyone of these men did not encourage the other or if anyone preached a message of despair other than hope, or if anyone cursed God other than waiting for his time to save, the story would be different, instead the men worked, hoped and believed together. They observed a discipline of faith and hope. Every little thing, unnoticeable and insignificant though it might have seemed contributed to their survival half a mile below ground and in temperature above 40 degrees!

This word of God this weekend talks about the need to pray always. These miners prayed and God heard. On the outskirts of a remote village in Africa, an eclipse of the moon appeared. As the shadows crept across the surface of the moon, residents were asked what was happening. Some said that the moon was sinking behind the mountain, others it was hiding behind a cloud but one Sunday school girl said 'it is the hand of God covering the moon.' Yes, to be able to see the hand of God at work in the world is one of the greatest assets one can have. When the shadows are gathering for life's dark moments, the person who can still see God's hand at work even in adverse situation will be master of any situation in life.

Dear Parishioners,

The Month of November in which we pray for the faithful departed should also remind us the reality of Purgatory and Hell. Preachers these days tend to speak more of Heaven as if the other two are outdated church inventions! Could this be the tactic that the devil who has toughened the consciences of people to think that 'there is no such a thing as sin is using? Is it true that only foolish people think of such things anymore?

The reality of the existence of hell is based on the teaching of Jesus himself. **Briefing on Roof Expenditure:**

During our deanery meeting last Tuesday Canon Gary Byrne said "the worst thing you can ask any Parish Priest is the condition of his church roof" He went on to say related topics and at the end I approached him and said 'Father, all the time you were speaking, I held my breath because I felt as if you were talking about St. Mary's.

Well, you all know that among the many things I inherited when I became your Parish Priest was a vast leaking roof from the Sister's Convent to the Garage on Hood Street. Some parts of the Church used to leak too. This has gone on for years. I thank you all who have cooperated with me to go on fixing these things.

The repair of the roof has been completed it involved overlaying a new rubberized Resitrix SK system, application of 80mm insulation boards to meet with building regulations, for which the manufacturer has given us a 20 years' guarantee.

The work needed the approval of the City Council, it had to meet Health & Safety regulations (H/S officials made several unannounced checks), and a Surveyor to make sure that it met with the requirements of the Law. All these came at a cost.

Roofing Contractor £41,059.20 incl. VAT. Building Control application submission £135.13. Building Control Inspection Fee £405.38 incl VAT. Surveyor's Fees £1900.25 incl VAT. Health and Safety Fees £350.

All these will come to cost about £.43, 861.58 incl. VAT. We had no choice, either we fixed the roof or we left it to collapse on our heads some day!

I thank the parishioners who have given so far £2,155.50 since 01/08/2010 and for £484.78 which was given in the second collection. All contributions to the roof total £2,640.28. This leaves us with a deficit of over 41,221.30 to pay.

Our Christmas bazaar due 4th December let us support it. Our second collection for the roof will be this weekend. Let us always do our best and from a pure motive of service to God and to his church.

"Lord it is Wonderful for us to be here" (Matt. 17:4)

Last Monday on a visit to London Road cemetery, we again prayed at the graves of those who have gone before us. Some of our former parish priests and parishioners are buried there. Visiting a cemetery, gives you a feeling of gratitude to God that we are still here; it makes you feel humble, to remember that we are nothing but dust, and to realize that our bond with God must be out of love and deep faith.

As you walk through the cemetery in prayer, you feel how close heaven is to us. It was at this St. Mary's Church that many of the dead invoked God's name. It was on these very pews that for almost 120 years generations of Christians called on God's name. Here, Jesus looked upon his people with kindness, granted their requests, extended his forgiveness and gave them peace. As your parish priest and taking into account that we are not here for comedy or to appear in the sight of people as God fearing but to worship God who is with us and among us building the kingdom, I appeal to you that we recognize God's presence as we pray.

I can assure you that the Sunday Mass at St. Mary's will not be rushed; it will not be unduly prolonged either. There are 168 hours or 10,080 minutes in a week. Jesus asks from us only ONE HOUR for Sunday Mass or just 60 minutes to be with him. (Peter you had no strength to keep awake with me one hour! Matt 26:40)

Coming late to Mass as some are tempted to do, is as a matter of fact cheating on God's time. We have 167 hours or 10,020 minutes every week for ourselves. Sunday program should set aside the hour for God for Sunday Mass uninterrupted.

I invite you to recognize God in the signs and symbols of our celebration. Unless it is in cases of extreme necessity, our Catholic tradition does not encourage us to leave the church before the priest. Faith demands that we observe silence in church and avoid idle conversations. The fact that we are in the presence of God should overwhelm us, "Be still and know that I'm God" People of no faith will think that they are greater than Jesus who humbles himself to live among us here, who speaks to us in his word and who feeds us in the Eucharist.

If our Sunday Mass was a comedy, I would have told you and acted as a comedian. But since we worship a God who is present among us, we cannot behave in any manner that does not proclaim that truth.

Dear Parishioners,

Thank you for supporting me in my ministry of service here at St. Mary's. Surely I commend you to God and to the word of his grace that has power to build you up and to give you your inheritance among all the sanctified (Acts 20:32).
