IT IS WINTER PLEASE WRAP UP:

For some people who have been here for a number of years, they might remember how St. Mary's Church used to be cold. If the church is freezing cold, it takes away ones concentration on prayer such that coldness becomes the focus. There is no doubt that each one of us enjoys entering into the church and you are welcomed with soothing warmth. This does not simply happen; it needs careful planning constant servicing of the boilers and radiators and above all the ability to pay gas bills. We can only use what we can afford to pay. Heating the church is very expensive just as you all find keeping your houses warm costly. I know that you take measures to keep your houses warm. I wish to ask you that you take the same measures when you come to church or when you use any rooms of the church where you need heating.

Not long ago heating our church was a very big problem and it is still a problem. At that time the easiest explanation was to condemn the boilers but thank God that they have served us for the last seven years since they were "scraped"!

I took it upon myself to make good study why the boilers were breaking down every other day and how the gas bills could be reduced. A new localized heating system was installed in the Lady's Chapel thanks to one former student Ms. Florence Osugo who substantially contributed to its purchase. That localized heating has helped us.

While keeping the church and parish hall warm is a top priority I wish to ask you to be considerate in the way how you dress. Some people who complain about the cold are often scantily dressed not because they lack cloths. You might be interested to know that we spend not less that £1000.00 every month to heat the church. This money comes from you. Nevertheless we have tried our best to keep the church and parish hall warm. As the cold spell progresses let us all cooperate to save energy wherever we may be either in our own homes, at place of work or in church.

Of late we had the parish bazaar, the aim of this annual event is to help us to raise money for the needs of our community, heating is one of those needs, unfortunately only a few understand this fact. If you need something you have to do something otherwise things do not simply happen. I wish you a Blessed Advent season. Since Advent comes to us during a cold season, please make sure that you dress warm especially when you are coming to church.

Is any parishioner sick or in hospital Please inform the Parish Priest or one of the Sisters. It is important that Catholics on admission to hospital tell their religion to be recorded and request a visit from the Catholic Chaplain.

<u>Decorating the Christmas</u> Crib will be undertaken by the Polish community this year. I'm pleased that they have asked me to do so. There will be Mass for the same Community during this Advent Saturdays 6th, 13th and 20th at 7:00am in the Lady's chapel to help children who are preparing for their First Holy Communion to have that feeling of how Advent is celebrated in Poland.

<u>Christmas Crib collection</u> last year enabled us to buy books for the training of missionary priests who study at the Apostles of Jesus Missionary Institute in Nairobi. The books worth £600.00 were purchased through Amazon book store. They were delivered in my office and they will be dispatched in the New Year. Since the demand for books to train priests is ongoing, I will request that our Crib collection this year will go to that cause. We pray that God sends to his people holy priests not social workers.

Exciting Christmas Carols in polish language will be performed on the 4th of January 2015 after the 9:30am Mass. The concert will take about 30 minutes.

<u>Parish Penitential Service</u> in preparation for Christmas will be on Thursday 18th December at 7:00pm. There will be a number of priests from our neighboring parishes to help you to make your confession.

<u>Special request for the Parish choir</u> which you all know plays a vital role in our Sunday worship. Being students many of our members have completed their studies and returned to their countries. We need more people to join the choir and come for practice. A good singing at Mass uplifts the prayerful spirit of all. Everyone is free to join us. Practice is every Friday from 7.00pm-9.00pm.
