### THANK YOU FOR YOUR FRUITFUL DISCUSSIONS

Dear Parishioners, during the week we met to look for the way to implement the Archbishop's request from us to reduce our weekend Masses from three to two. I'm grateful for all who came to the Church hall on their respective days to discuss this matter. We need to be aware that the people of God who make up St. Mary's parish do not necessarily live within its boundaries; to think so is a great self-deception, instead our parishioners come from all over the corners of Coventry even as far as Nuneaton, Lamington-Spa, Bedworth, Rugby, Tile Hill, Holbrookes etc. There is a saying that "what makes a family is where one's heart is" so it is with St. Mary's, what makes membership to her is that it is here where our heart is.

There is no doubt that these adjustments will cause unease but we must never forget that obedience to do the pastoral requests of our bishops is the best thing we can do for the good of the church. Obedience is better than any sacrifices someone can make.

As your Parish Priest, I was pleased that a good number of you turned up for the meetings and that each one of you had the opportunity to speak out honestly his or her opinions concerning the matter.

In his recent pastoral letter, the Archbishop asked us to have the willingness to see the bigger picture by taking into account the pastoral needs across the city. If we need a priest in our parish, we ought to realize that other parishes need priests as well. It is on this account that we are asked to see the bigger picture and to be generous by considering some changes in our weekend routine in order to support the inevitable changes rather than looking for a more convenient time elsewhere.

I have read the pastoral letter again and again; as you do so, you soon realize that the Archbishop has left the destiny of each parish in Coventry into the hands of its members. He wants them to make decisions which of course will have far reaching consequences. We must not be shortsighted, we must not be discouraged, we must not let the Archbishop to function as an arbitrator in a case of this kind even though he has indicated that that can be the case when an agreement cannot be locally reached.

Parish priests around the city are engaged in consultations with their parishioners on how to implement the cutting down of Masses. I'm so pleased that our consultations here at St. Mary's were supported and discussed with love and affection for our parish.

Is any parishioner sick or in hospital? Please inform the Parish Priest or one of the Sisters. It is important that Catholics on admission to hospital tell their religion to be recorded and request a visit from the Catholic Chaplain.

RCIA: The next session will take place on Tuesday 4<sup>th</sup> February at 6.00pm in the parish hall. All our candidates to be baptized and to be received into full communion with the Catholic Church are reminded to be present.

Baptism Course for the parents who wish to have their children baptized will be on Monday 3<sup>rd</sup> February at 5.30pm in the parish hall.

First Holy Communion preparation course for our school children will commence with a meeting for parents of children in year 3 on Monday 24th February 2014 at 6.00pm. If your child is attending a Non-Catholic School and you wish that he/she should receive Communion here at St Mary's please contact Mrs Pauline McDonald, the Head Teacher in the school. We can now confirm that the date for children to receive the Sacrament of First Holy Communion is Saturday 14<sup>th</sup> June 2014 at 10:30am.

Parish Membership registration: was mentioned earlier at the beginning of the vear. The idea has delayed to be implemented because I have not come across a suitable book that would meet our requirements. Suggestions or samples of such record book are very welcome.

# Other Matters of Importance Timetable set by the Archbishop on new Mass times:

- 1. Weekend of 11 / 12 January 2014 letter from Archbishop Bernard was read in all parishes of the City of Coventry announcing the decision of 2 Masses per parish.
- From mid-Jan, until Sunday 23rd Feb., consultation period. Every parish looks at its Mass attendance, its current times and what their preference for revised Mass times (with no guarantee). Where possible, each parish will be able to keep one established time.
- 3. From 24th February to 2nd March the clergy will review the preferences of their parishioners and shape a proposal to give to the Archbishop.
- 4. First Sunday of Lent (9th March) announcement of new Mass times for the City.
- 5. 27<sup>th</sup> April 2014 implementation of new Mass times on 2 Mass policy per parish.

**Warning:** no parish should automatically seek to keep times unchanged, as the provision across the Deanery is of a higher priority than the needs of any individual parish.
