IT IS NOT WHAT YOU WANT 'TO DO' BUT WHAT YOU WANT 'TO BECOME:'

It is a blessing to celebrate another New Year in our life. During this time you are likely to hear people speak ill of the previous year especially if they met with difficulties. Well I look at it differently; a year that sees me through and ushers me into a new one is very good indeed no matter what might have happened it. That is why when I come to the end of the year I have a feeling of thankfulness to God for a year that made me to experience life.

The beginning of a New Year is much like a fresh snow where everything is covered under a blanket but we do not know what exactly they are. Chaplains are often no longer automatically given the names of Catholic patients. Many health care providers (e.g. Hospitals, Nursing Homes, Mental Health Units) apportion resources for chaplaincy in line with how many requests are made so you are actually doing the Church a favour by requesting the chaplaincy and sacraments whilst in hospital.
