THIS KIND OF PREPARATION IS BAD ENOUGH:

Before performing a baptism, a priest approached a young dad and said to him, "You know John baptism is a serious step. Are you prepared for it?" "I think so," the man replied; "my wife has made appetizers and we have a caterer coming to provide plenty of cookies and cakes for all of our guests, yes we are quite prepared Father." "I don't mean that," reacted the priest. "I mean, are you prepared spiritually?" "Oh, sure," came the reply. "I've got enough bottles of Dry Gin, Some Vodka and a case of Brand Whiskey, we are spiritually prepared too!"

Well, it is funny to see how people prepare themselves for sacraments. Baptism, First Holy Communion and Confirmation and the notion of funeral services has changed these days. In the past when people went to the funeral of someone, the main reason was to pray for the repose of the deceased, those present joined in the prayers and hymns, they opened their mouth and raised their voices as if to tell God we have no one but you'. These days if you want to meet people who hardly know how to read, if you want to meet the deaf and dumb simply go to some Christian funerals. What a colossal ignorance of faith and Christian behavior at Mass by people who claim to be baptized these days!

Advent is a time of preparation to receive the Lord, to return to the obedience of faith, to recognize him in the needy to make him visible in every fabric of our lives. It has nothing to do with the madness of shopping or extravagant eating and drinking. Advent is first and foremost an appeal to the human soul with its relationship with God and neighbor.

It is a scandalizing experience that many Christians are so ignorant of faith and lack good behavior in church at Mass. How unfortunate that some chew gum in church, and others are not bothered to leave litter behind as if they were for picnic! For those who practice the faith and who are aware of what to do, the best thing is to give a public good example by promptly doing what we ought to do. The baptized people who forget their identity make a poor show of themselves before those who expect them to know. We should feel proud to show to others that we believe in God, that we still practice our Christian faith. Jesus encouraged it when he said "In the same way your light must shine in the sight of men, so that seeing your good works, they may give praise to your Father in heaven. Matt. 5:16.
