## DO NOT BE TAKEN UP BY THE GIFT TO FORGET THE GIVER:

Not long ago, I came across someone deeply in prayer in our church. From the gestures made I noticed that there was something special that was being asked for. I came to learn later that the person was praying to God for a job. We all know how life can be stressful and boring if there is nothing to look forward to for the day. Jesus told us, "ask and you will receive" he kept his promise the prayer was heard on high and the job was given with a good salary to crown it all. Once the job was acquired that was also the end of that person coming to church! A weekly program was set: working Monday to Friday, Saturday was set aside for shopping and Sunday morning was set for the fitness center (gym) and the afternoon was for lying in bed to relax the mind and to pamper oneself!

Missing the person with whom we had prayed to God for a job left me wondering what had happened; was the job offered, had the person moved away; was he sick? These and many other questions crossed over my mind. Later we bumped into each other's way outside Sainsbury. 'It is a long time I saw you' I said. "Ooh Father I have a good job now, it is busy, busy, busy all the time. I work Monday to Friday, I do shopping on Saturday and lie in on Sunday to relax the mind; by the way I go to the gym on Sunday to keep fit you know!"

It is common to meet people who behave like this these days who turn to a certain god to ask for something but dump him as soon as they have received what they asked for. In the Bible many people asked Jesus for favors; Jews and Gentiles, 'Lord help me' they would say. There is not a single incident where Jesus denied answering a plea; he was however grieved by those who received his gifts and failed to recognize him as the giver. While he was angry with the town of Capernaum and Bethsaida where many of his miracles were performed but refused to believe in him, he was keen to appreciate the few who remembered to thank him such as the Samaritan leper, and the Roman centurion.

It is true that we live a busy life but it is important never to forget to give thanks to Him who has given us the opportunity to be busy. Idleness can kill. I understand that Sunday wages are much higher than weekdays, but I think such attractive wages are but a test of our fidelity. You should never spend your energy to enjoy the gift and totally lose sight or recognition of the giver.
