OUR PARISH REPORT - VISITATION 1ST & 2ND NOVEMBER 2014.

This weekend I present the last part of the report that has been sent to the Diocese following the visit of Bp. William Kenny. It was read to us but it is important that you read it in your own time and reflect on it.

Infrastructural development of the parish since the last parish visitation:

At the last visitation the parish had serious infrastructural problems. Just to remind ourselves: The massive flat roof from the Convent through the parish hall to the presbytery garage was leaking. The church needed redecoration; the car park needed a new surface. The following has been done: Complete redecoration of the church; new flat roof has replaced the old one. Our Lady's chapel has been refurbished it is open every day for people of the city who need a moment of prayer and quiet. The parish hall and kitchen were redecorated and refurbished they are set up as commercial enterprise for the parish. Church car park resurfaced and set up as a commercial enterprise for the parish. The parish website is set up and maintained we have live broadcast of Mass via the web. These achievements have been possible due to our working together knowing that WE are the Parish.

SS. Mary and Benedict Primary School:

Our parish has one primary school. There 308 pupils out of which only 152 that is 50% are Catholics. 35 languages are spoken; children from ethnic minorities form 70% of the cohort 55% of children receive free school meals. The parish does not receive unanimous and generous support from all parents who take their children to the school. If parents need their child to go to the Catholic School, they need to support the Catholic Church that provides it, but this is not always the case. We thank the teachers and supporting members of staff who help our children to achieve such high academic standards: Standards that are consistently above the national average: as well as providing excellent spiritual and moral guidance.

Challenges facing the parish:

Lack of priests in the diocese; means that the parish could have some difficulties in the future that might lead to losing a resident priest at St. Mary's. Our parish priest does not have many opportunities to visit his family. The parish has very few permanent resident Catholics this is brought about by the expansion of the city and of Coventry University. Emergence of new churches (Pentecostals/ evangelical). Influx of Muslims into the area, this has also affected the number of catholic children in our school. Maintenance of church property (the buildings, car park, boilers etc.)

Parish debts and liabilities:

In 2008, the parish incurred a massive debt of £100,000.00 to pay off liabilities to

contractors and to repair the flat roof. This debt has been paid off thanks to the hard work of everyone. Money has been raised through, Christmas bazaars, parish dances, personal donations and stringent expenditure policies of the parish priest. The parish has an outstanding debt of £10,000.00 due to be paid in 2017.

Future Plans and Priorities:

As a parish we want to continue focusing on our spiritual growth, to make sure that the parish is rooted in Christ. This will require a prayerful devotion to the faith.

Due to the expansion of Coventry University, we envisage our parish will be within the center of the university. We embrace the fact that our congregation will be young, fleeting and multicultural. We will continue to welcome them and engage them in parish activities.

Our Catholic School forms the future of our parish; we call upon our catholic parents not only to send their children to the school but also to bring them to the Sunday Mass. At present there are 308 pupils out of these only 152 are Catholics making it 50%!

We thank Your Lordship Bishop William Kenny for making this pastoral visit to our parish on behalf of his Grace Bernard Longley the Archbishop of Birmingham and on your own behalf as our area bishop.

May God continue to bless us all. END.
