FIDELITY IS PROVED AT THE DIFFICULT TIME:

Finally His Grace the Archbishop has made a final decision concerning the provision of Masses within our denary. This was reached as a result of your involvement in the process which gave him insight to reach this decision. The denary had 60 Masses every weekend we have lost 28 and remained with only 32 Masses across the city. At St Mary's we have lost the Saturday 6:00 O'clock Mass, I consider losing a Mass a very serious matter, however every difficulty has an opportunity. The opportunity for us at this time is to consolidate our efforts to build our parish.

Certainly we have come a long way to where we are. You must have heard me at one time telling you that when I was appointed to St. Mary's, Archbishop Vincent bluntly told me that "there was a plan to close St. Mary's because the diocese had tried all the means" but he encouraged me to come. In his words, he presumed that you the parishioners and I would have our own new approach to issues and work together to solve them and to build our faith.

Persons visiting our parish admire the liveliness of our liturgy, the beauty of our church and its cleanliness not to forget the community spirit when it comes to doing things. No single parish priest can do these things without his people. This is how your involvement and fidelity to the parish has turned it round. The future of St. Mary's has been demarcated by the Archbishop who has decided that our parish adopts a two-weekend- Mass policy just like all other parishes in the city of Coventry. Painful as this might appear to be, it is yet a challenge for all of us to quickly embrace the changes and continue to build the parish we have always called our spiritual home. The Archbishop is not asking us to find an easier way out but to prove our fidelity and loyalty to our parishes.

I know that moving to other parishes might be an attractive option for some but we need to look at it this way, how many of us will abandon a good cause simply because it serves their personal convenience? St. Mary's church is the second oldest in the city, it was a place of refuge for poor people who escaped hunger and poverty in Ireland, survivors from Eastern Europe who escaped tyranny of the 1st and 2nd World Wars and also a home to many immigrants from Africa after colonialism. St. Mary's is the only parish in Coventry which receives those people who society tends to reject: the alcoholics, drug addicts and sex workers. God identifies with the poor and the weak. To abandon a place like this soaked in the prayers of those in particular need will be a missed opportunity.
