### RECLAIM THIS NICKNAME FOR YOURSELF

When our work is all done and the race ended, it will be time to return home. It will not matter whether all the work will be perfectly done or not, but it will please God that we tried our best and put the best into what we were asked to do. Will he blame us for the work not completed, no; instead he will cheer us for our tireless fidelity.

These might be the feelings of many of us as we celebrate our last Saturday for Sunday Mass. I'm sure that when this Mass is reinstated, it will not be during my lifetime at St. Mary's.' As a priest I feel sad when we have to slim down our missions instead of expanding them. It is a wakeup call!

Let us realize that the Lord is opening us up to the reality of a mission in Coventry, namely to reflect on who we are, and on what we ought to be in our city. "Christian" was a nickname given to a group of people at Antioch in present day Syria who lived a life entirely dedicated to loving God and neighbor; a life committed to serve Jesus Christ. This captured the attention of the people that as a result they just nicknamed those people "Christian" Acts 11:26.

I don't know what kind of nickname that people of this generation like the Syrians of that time would give to us. It is on this point that I wish to reiterate that the loss of many Masses from this weekend onwards in our city is a call to re-evaluate our mission as Catholics.

As Christians, we must get used to the idea of doing our bit, in our own time in the best way possible. Some of us might be taken up by the thought of what happened many years ago in the church even before they existed. Others might be worried of what will happen in the church so many years after we have gone. I'm not bothered by the past and I'm not worried of the future; what worries me is what is happening now because the baton is in our hands.

At home when I was growing up during the time of Idi Amin, we used candles powered by kerosene to light the house. Sometimes we could not afford lighting two candles because kerosene was not available and we were poor to afford it. That single candle lit in the house kept the home alive, it guided us and we never stumbled.

In the current changes remember that as a practicing Christian you are a light to others, don't give up, don't get discouraged, your fidelity is the reason for someone else to try. Above all, let us reclaim our ancient nickname through perseverance.
