SOME OF YOU WILL BE PUT TO DEATH LK 21:16

This week I heard about the death of a fellow priest Fr. John Baptist Ssennyondo which took place in Mexico. He and I were born and brought up in the same village. As we grew up, we developed an ambition to become missionary priests inspired by our parents. I joined the Missionary Institute of the Apostles of Jesus and John joined the Comboni Missionaries. To prepare ourselves for missionary work, in 1978 we started a Catholic Church choir in our village. The youth joined it and he was the music conductor. This initiative consolidated the faith of young people in our village through the war that toppled Idi Amini between 1978-79.

Fr. John was ordained priest for the Verona (Comboni) Missionaries in 1991. He became the first priest and missionary from my village. When I was ordained priest later our ambition was to become like the first apostles of the Lord to go and preach the gospel. Our small village produced two missionaries and the people have been so proud of their sons at the frontline of gospel proclamation among nations.

Last July I learned that Fr. John, 55, was kidnapped soon after celebrating Mass in the town of Santa Cruz, in the Diocese of Chilpancingo-Chilapa (Mexico) by armed men who accused him of refusing to baptize a daughter of their local gang leader. He went missing on April 30th 2014, since then we have been in agony trying to trace his whereabouts. His body was found in a mass grave with 13 other victims in the town of Ocotitlan in the southern state of Guerrero. The mass grave was found as part of the search for the remains of 43 university students who went missing in the area of Ayotzinapa on September 26.

On the day of our ordination, the then Bishop of my home diocese of Masaka Rt. Rev. Adrian K. Ddungu (RIP) spoke to us about the challenging nature of the missionary life we were being ordained for. "Beloved Sons,' he said, 'the Catholic diocese of Masaka, is sending you out to go and proclaim the gospel of Jesus Christ, just as he sent the 12 apostles. We do not know what will happen to you but we firmly believe that he who has called you will be with you. Some of you might be put to death, but when that moment comes, embrace it with faith and hope in Him" None of us knew that this would take place in the 23rd year of Fr. John's ordination!

Let us remember that while the cost of discipleship is great, the rewards of fidelity will be greater. Martyrdom is not a thing of the past it happens even as we read this sad story. May God rest his soul in peace.

Is any parishioner sick or in hospital Please inform the Parish Priest or one of the Sisters. It is important that Catholics on admission to hospital tell their religion to be recorded and request a visit from the Catholic Chaplain.
