WHAT OUGHT LTO DO?

A good number of Catholics in our city have expressed their disappointment by the new Mass times announced recently across Coventry. There have been good impressions however showed by the determination of many to do their best. Doing one's best is the best one can do.

Many years ago while taking a course in Ethics, I remember my lecturer in Christian ethics walking into class and asking us "What is the fundamental question in Ethics? We had many answers but none of them carried an ethical value until when he said

In any moral behavior the fundamental question is not what MUST I do or what SHOULD I do, but the fundamental question is "WHAT OUGHT I TO DO"? The word "ought" carries with it the need for doing the right thing as dictated by inner conscience.

Christians today are faced with a numerous difficulties which call into play a demand for doing the right thing following the conscience. The conscience cannot deceive us; therefore it is important that we revisit that question from time to time with a Christian attitude.

As your priest, I have been blessed with the privilege to stand at the door every Sunday to greet the people as they come to church and also to stand there to see them going into the world to spread the gospel. Talking to people, you become aware how serious people from other parts of the world value the Christian faith. Yes we to ought to be passionate about our faith and to do whatever it takes not to fall away from it. Recently I introduced a lady at one of our Sunday Masses from Taiwan who visiting Coventry was mindful to find a church where she would attend the Sunday Mass! This is an extraordinary witness all of us ought to emulate when we are on holidays.

A lot of hard work has gone into our Catholic Faith in this Country. It is a characteristic of Catholics to obey with faith the teaching of the Church and to follow the guidance of the leaders of the Church. Now that new Mass times have been announced in our parish WHAT OUGHT I TO DO? St Ignatius of Antioch once declared: "It is not that I want merely to be called a Christian, but to actually be one. Yes, if I prove to be one, then I can have the name...Come fire, cross, battling with wild beasts, wrenching of bones, mangling of limbs, crushing of my whole body, cruel tortures of the Devil--Only let me get to Jesus Christ!"
