IF IT MAKES SENSE LET US SUPPORT IT:

Last Monday Mr Tony Smith and I spent the day packing and sealing boxes containing spiritual and academic books which were purchased for the Apostles of Jesus Seminary in Nairobi for the training of priests. The money came from the Crib donations you gave during Christmas time. It was a very joyful moment to see twelve boxes full of books being dispatched to Ipswich from where they will be placed in a large container heading for the Kenyan port of Mombasa. I wish to thank all of you who visited the Crib at Christmas and for the donations there given.

In my talks I have often encouraged you to support seminaries. Well, a good priest can only come from a good seminary with solid formation. I had the chance to teach in the seminaries when I was in Africa. First in 1988 I taught in a Seminary of our Order at Uruthiru in the Diocese of Meru in Kenya. In 1993, I was sent to teach in the Seminary in Uganda in the Diocese of Moroto and in 1995 I was posted to teach in the Major Seminary of the Institute at Langata in Nairobi Kenya. I taught there for 10 years. As a trainer of men called to the priesthood I came to realise how important a book is to a man training to become a priest. A priest ought not to have some knowledge but a wide knowledge about everything. No one would wish to have a mediocre formed professional. This applies to our priests too. As Catholics when we place a book on the shelves of a seminary library we equip our future priests for their future ministry.

Do not be deceived to think that a Catholic priest is 'second hand' in the community. What I know is that the catholic priest is one of the most reliable men you can find around. I know for example of many people who were baptised in the Catholic Church but they go to 'pub-based evangelical churches' because they are physically entertaining and less demanding; it all depends on the pastor. When such people come to real issues that need an authoritative endorsement: (immigration papers, certification of identity etc.), they don't go to their pastors, instead they go to the Catholic priest. Catholic priesthood is not a matter of choice; it is a calling from God. We should be proud that our Church has men in whom society has invested so much trust.

At present our parish is served by a missionary priest, this should remind us that we do not know where from our next priest will come. Therefore let us support such a good cause in the church, for the good of the expansion of God's reign among us.

Is any parishioner sick or in hospital Please inform the Parish Priest or one of the Sisters. It is important that Catholics on admission to hospital tell their religion to be recorded and request a visit from the Catholic Chaplain.
