LET US SUPPORT EACH OTHER TO PRAY:

We have been so blessed to have so many people who come to pray in our church on Sunday. There is no doubt that many churches are closed because only a few people go to them to pray. Here at our parish almost 600 people come to the Sunday Mass. God summons us from our homes to come into his presence to speak to him and to listen to him. Don't be surprised that you might be the only person from your street or even from your whole family who has gone to Mass this Sunday! It means that when we come to pray, there are so many people we are representing.

A good number of people come early enough so as to have personal preparation to pray; others choose to stay back for a while after the final hymn and blessing. May I remind you that it is a Christian duty of everyone to help one another to speak to God in prayer by observing silence before and after Holy Mass. It is our ancient custom here at St. Mary's not to talk inside the church unnecessarily because the church is a holy place where we make personal and community encounter with God.

In the Holy Scriptures we read of the Prophet Elijah's encounter with God at Mt. Horeb (1Kngs 19:9-13).

A mighty wind came, so strong it tore the mountains and shattered the rocks, but Yahweh was not in the wind. After the wind came an earthquake but Yahweh was not in the earthquake. After the earthquake came a fire but Yahweh was not in the fire. After the fire there came the sound of a gentle breeze, and when Elijah heard this he covered his face with his clock and went out and stood at the entrance of the cave. Then a voice came to him which said 'What are you doing here Elijah'?'

It is in silence that God speaks to us and it is only in the silence of our souls that we can find God "Speak Lord, your servant is listening. Therefore I turn to you to observe true silence before and after Mass for the good of those who have something to speak to God. Do not be so much in hurry to get out of church as if the building is on fire, and do not be hesitant to come early enough to say your prayers. Every moment spent in prayer will always be met with God's providential response.

Is any parishioner sick or in hospital? Please inform the Parish Priest or one of the Sisters. It is important that Catholics on admission to hospital tell their religion to be recorded and request a visit from the Catholic Chaplain.

Pastoral

Live Camera: I have a plan to install live camera facility in the church so that my parishioners who are housebound can follow the Mass and other liturgical functions from their homes. This is a pastoral outreach to them. They have always been with us for prayers but they cannot manage to do so because of ill health. Once installed, they will be able to tune in for the Mass at St. Mary's from any part of the world. I will be pleased to know your opinion over it.

Baptism preparation course for parents who wish to have their children baptized will be on Monday 2nd June 2014 at 5.30pm in the parish hall.

First Holy Communion: children from our school will be making their First Holy Communion on Saturday 14th June at 10.30am. I fully understand the excitement that it brings in the life of the children after all they have waited for so long sometimes asking their parents and teachers why they do not receive Holy Communion at Mass. The true meaning of Catholic education does not refer to taking a child to a catholic school but it refers to the duty of the parents to bring up a child in the knowledge of and faith in Jesus Christ. As the children make their final preparation I pray that their parents, Godparents and their sponsors will help them to understand what a great mystery they have been appointed by Jesus to proclaim to others through their personal holiness.
