### THIS CANNOT BE RIGHT BEHAVIOR

This weekend I'm celebrating the Sunday Mass in the huge church of the Apostles of Jesus Missionaries in Nairobi surrounded by hundreds of seminarians in their final years of training for the priesthood. As I sat in the pews in total silence except the little noise made by prayer books as students reflect on the Word of God in their meditation, I came to remember that a good number of you have spoken to me about the difficulties you have to pray due to much noise made by some people who literally engage in conversations before and soon after the Mass. This is not right and we should restrain from this practice as much as possible.

If you want to know the real sacredness of this place, I encourage you to look at every place in our church. When the Bishop of Birmingham decided to build a new church in Hillfields area of Coventry in 1800's, the architects put a lot of details into it which we might not have ever noticed. These details were meant to remind every person who would step into this church to know that this is a sacred dwelling place of God. The ceiling pattern of this Church is in an upside-down-boat form to bring about the idea of Peter the fisherman of Galilee. Jesus was always present in that boat, and it was not far from that boat that He asked Peter to cast his nets in the deeper waters.

The holiness of a church as a building is shown by the people who go there and what they do once they are there. In the early church, St. Paul denounced worshippers who went into the church just to indulge themselves with all sorts of things including food and drink. "Surely you have homes for eating and drinking in? Surely you have enough respect for the community of God not to make poor people embarrassed? What am I to say to you? Congratulate you on this!" 1Cor. 11: 17-34.

Giving due respect to the church building is something that ought to flow from faith. If you used tissues for one reason or the other it is not right to leave them either on the floor or in the pews; take them with you. If you came with an umbrella, an extra jacket or a hat, it is not respect to leave them hanging at the back of the church; and if a child becomes restless during Mass, don't pay a deaf ear or engage in play with him or her, instead find a safe place where a child can be pacified. In our church there are two places to help families with a restless situation. One is the Lady's chapel; the other is Divine Mercy Chapel at the back of the church. Both places are sound proof. We stand on a holy ground, let us behave accordingly.

Is any parishioner sick or in hospital? Please inform the Parish Priest or one of the Sisters. It is important that Catholics on admission to hospital tell their religion to be recorded and request a visit from the Catholic Chaplain.

RCIA (Rite of Christian Initiation of Adults): If you would like to become a member of the Catholic Church please note that in September each year the RCIA programme begins. It involves catechesis into the truth of our faith. If you belong to any other denomination but you would like to be baptized or to be received into full communion with the Catholic Church, I would like to encourage you. May I ask you to contact the Parish Priest or one of the Parish Sisters to whom you need to tell about your intention. This will help us to plan our pastoral activities to help you out.

<u>Parish Choir:</u> Our parish choir comprises mainly of the international students. Many have completed their studies successfully and have returned to their homes. We need new members. If you wish to be a part of our choir and enhance the beauty of our liturgical celebrations just turn up and join in. We have our choir practice every Friday at 8.00pm.
