# JOHN VIANNEY SAW HIMSELF AS A PILGRIM

On Monday 4<sup>th</sup> August will be a feast of St. John Mary Vianney patron of Parish Priests. He was a son of a peasant farmer, a slow and unpromising candidate to the priesthood. He wanted to become a priest; yet he had to overcome his meagre formal schooling, which inadequately prepared him for seminary studies.

His failure to grasp Latin forced him to discontinue but his vision of being a priest urged him to seek private tuition. After a lengthy battle with the books, John was ordained in 1818 and sent to a rural parish of Ars-en-Dombes an isolated village far from Lyon for fear he might meet learned intellectuals who would have challenged him to humiliate him. Situations calling for "impossible" deeds followed him everywhere. As pastor of the parish at Ars, John met people who were indifferent and quite comfortable with their style of living. His vision led him through severe fasts and short nights of sleep.

Fr. John Vianney prayed and worked for the conversion of his parishioners. Although he saw himself as unworthy of his mission, he allowed himself to be consumed by the love of God as he served the people. His reputation as a confessor grew rapidly, and pilgrims traveled from all over France to come to him in the Sacrament of Reconciliation. Firmly committed to the conversion of the people, he would spend up to 16 hours a day in the confessional. Indifference toward catholic teaching, coupled with a love for material comfort, seem to be common signs of our times. <u>A person from another planet observing us would not likely judge us to be pilgrim people, on our way to somewhere else. John Vianney, on the other hand, was a man on a journey with his goal before him at all times.</u>

A Christian with a vision will keep going with increasing strength. He/she will find no mountain high enough, no river wide enough, no ocean deep enough to hinder him/her from achieving the goal. This can be possible only if one puts God at the centre! Let us have a vision and keep Christ as the Goal of our lives and strive with determination.John Vianney died on August 4, 1859. Over 1,000 people attended his funeral, including the bishop and priests of the diocese, who already viewed his life as a model of priestly holiness.

Is any parishioner sick or in hospital? Please inform the Parish Priest or one of the Sisters. It is important that Catholics on admission to hospital tell their religion to be recorded and request a visit from the Catholic Chaplain.
