### HE WHO IS NOT DISCIPLINED BY HIS MOTHER WILL BE DISCIPLINED BY THE WORLD

This statement comes from the wisdom of the African people. It is based on real life experience. It is a warning and a wake-up call to parents and guardians to take charge of the discipline of their children. I was in the supermarket the other day and there was this nursery age child who was on a shopping extravaganza. The boy thought that all that was on display was free; whatever he wanted to have he threw it into the shopping trolley. There was commotion and embarrassment at the exit counter, the parents did not have money to pay for the gadgets the boy had picked up for his shopping neither would he accept to leave behind what he considered as his right to take home! The parents were at a loss, they gave back some of the necessary provisions such as foodstuff in order to pay for the boy's gadgets.

Reflecting on this I ask myself who is responsible between the child and parents when it comes to making choices and taking final decisions on what to do and on what is not to be done? When I was growing up my parents used to <u>deny</u> me what I <u>wanted</u> but they always <u>gave</u> me what I <u>needed</u>. They took decisions it was my duty as a child to listen and to obey them. What they decided was not a matter of debate whether we the children would accept it or not. But things have changed and in my view they have changed for the worst. It is the children who tell parents what they have to do! In the past children ate whatever food mum put at the table, these days children are asked what they want to eat. The consequences are that parents have to spend money beyond their means to satisfy the demands of children who are not properly trained to <u>live</u> within the limits of their needs and not of their wants. How much have you prepared your children to live within their means and how are you teaching them to live within their needs not their wants?

Some older persons like me notice with horror how crime is becoming younger and younger. These days children commit crimes which people of my generation would not think of! There must be something wrong somewhere in the fabric of our families and in the society. Fortunately no child is born a criminal or with criminal attitude; these are inclinations which they acquire as they interact with their parents, peers and the media. How are you preparing your children to resist radicalization? It is sad to say that when the world catches up with someone who was not well disciplined by his parents, it is not so sympathetic. Mob justice and imprisonment of juveniles are very common. Remember, a person who is not disciplined by the mother will be disciplined by the world and it will be very painful for both.
