KNOW THAT I'M WITH YOU ALWAYS

The liturgical year of the church ends with these words of Jesus "Know that I'm with you always, yes even to the end of time." Presence can be assuring but it can also be frightening. If you have a terminally sick patient, the presence of someone with you is very assuring; it does not matter whether the person is rich or poor, great or small, young or old, all that matters is that someone is with you. But there are cases where the presence of someone can be frightening indeed. Try to think of the burglar downstairs in the middle of the night, an armed opponent laying an ambush or a stalker trailing you; the presence of such a person is dreadful.

When Jesus promised that he would be with us his followers, he did not tell us in which form his presence would be felt, but his presence to us in the Eucharist is reassuring indeed. The three cardinal virtues of Faith Hope and Love help us to understand this. When something takes place there is something or someone behind it. Whatever happens has a cause and nothing occurs except for a reason. Everything has a purpose and nothing happens to us without meaning no matter how good or painful it may be.

Persons whose minds are less inclined to believe in God see good things coming their way as a result of their hard work and they see bad things as blind destiny. The Christian mind does not look at things that way, whatever we are or have are due to God's providence and holy will. Our intimacy with Jesus in the Eucharist should help us as Christians to grow in knowing how to read the language of God.

The other week some of our children from Polish catholic tradition received their First Holy Communion. The demanding preparation and the all-engaging celebration of the event reminded me of the greatness of being a Christian and a member of the Catholic Church. For me the event was God sent to remind me (and you too) never to take lightly what seem to the unbeliever as accidents.

Surely it was not necessary that Jesus should save us through the incarnation, his dreadful death on the cross and through his resurrection which bore no eye witnesses. Jesus knew that our mind would never contain God's doing in our life that is why He just told us: "know that I'm with you always, yes even to the end of time" Mt: 28:20. All we need is never to despair because someone is with us all the time, his name is Jesus.

Feast of the Most Sacred Heart of Jesus: The devotion to the Sacred Heart of Jesus continued to grow during the middle Ages and in 1353 Pope Innocent VI instituted a Mass honoring the mystery of the Sacred Heart. During the age of the Protestant revolution, devotion to the Sacred Heart was practiced in hope of restoring peace to a world shattered by political and religious persecution. Shortly thereafter, the devotion grew due to the fervor surrounding the apparitions of our Lord to St. Margaret Mary Alacogue (1647-90).

In 1899, Pope Leo XIII consecrated the world to the Sacred Heart of Jesus. Successive Popes have encouraged the faithful to offer prayers and penances to the Sacred Heart in reparation for the many sins of the world. Considering our present day and age, the growing apathy and secularism, we too should turn again in loving devotion to the Sacred Heart of Jesus and ask Him to pour forth His grace. We must strive to make our hearts like His own, for He said, "Blessed are the pure of heart, for they shall see God" (Mt 5:8).

In the Preface of the Mass in honor of the Sacred Heart of Jesus we hear: "Lifted high on the Cross, Christ gave His life for us, so much did He love us. From His wounded side flowed blood and water, the fountain of the sacramental life in the Church. To His open Heart the Savior invites all men, to draw water in joy from the springs of salvation." Let us entrust ourselves to the Sacred Heart of Jesus
