OUR PARISH PRIEST TOLD US WHY HE IS NOT HAPPY

Every priest you see is somebody's son, someone's brother. Every Nun you see is somebody's beloved daughter. Priests and religious come from families and from homes like your own. They are chosen by God from children just like your own. When they felt the desire to become religious, they were not dissuaded by their friends and families instead they were cheered on and supported to follow the calling. It is unimaginable that even pious Catholics do forget that the men and women who are at their service daily as priests and religious come from families, they miss them and miss family gatherings and events like birthdays, funerals etc. I have heard of some people who treat priests and speak about them as if they were the filth of the earth! Some so called good Catholics are also good at this; but there is not a single incident in the history of salvation where God chose a perfect man or woman to fulfil his plan. Not even Jesus made a perfect choice of his apostles even after spending the whole night in prayer (Lk. 6:12-16); Judas the man who betrayed him was among them!

Many people expect to have a 'perfect priest', but I don't think that I will live long enough to see one. What I know is that I have lived long enough to meet priests and religious who needed my prayers and support. Priesthood is a vocation which no one embraces unless he is called by God himself. The dwindling number of priests in England and Wales is being felt in all dioceses. Some priests have to look after a number of parishes and it is not always possible to have Mass in every church every Sunday. The average age of priests in England & Wales is rising alarmingly. There are not enough new priests to replace those who die, retire or leave the active ministry. This situation speaks volumes of what is going on inside the walls of catholic families, just as what is going on in the street reflects on what goes on inside the walls of families in our country.

What do you think about this? How will society survive without the prophetic priestly voice of a priest in our midst? As your priest, some people do ask me whether I'm happy. My answer is always <u>NO I'm not happy</u> the reason is simple; <u>No one has expressed an interest to take over my office as a priest</u>. I would feel much happier if there was someone from your family or from this parish who is training for priesthood or religious life because that would assure the continuity of the Lord's ministry given to me. You can become a missionary without leaving your home by supporting a student to train for the priesthood. Yes you can do it, ask me how and I will show you.

Is any parishioner sick or in hospital Please inform the Parish Priest or one of the Sisters. It is important that Catholics on admission to hospital tell their religion to be recorded and request a visit from the Catholic Chaplain.

This year's theme for Vocations Sunday is "Change a Life." This reflects the dramatic change for anyone who begins to answer their vocation, and deepen their relationship with God. We pray for an increase in vocations to the priesthood, diaconate and religious life in our Archdiocese. There will be the annual collection for the Clergy Training Fund which supports our seminarians and students to diaconate. Thank you for your prayers and generosity.

<u>First Holy Communion</u> will take place on Sat 13th June 2015: I urge the parents of those children who will be receiving their first Holy Communion to accompany them in their preparation and help them to understand the meaning and gravity of the Sacrament. Let us support them with our prayers.

Polish children who are doing catechism will receive their First Holy Communion on Sunday 24th May during the 9:30am Mass. They will make their first Confessions on Saturday 16th May at 7:00pm. Please keep them in your prayers.

<u>Month of May</u> is dedicated to Mary the Mother of Jesus and our Mother. Let us ask her intercession particularly for our brothers and sisters who are persecuted because of their faith in Jesus. May they be strengthened in their fidelity to Christ and be delivered from the hands of their persecutors.

<u>Vatican City Catholic News Agency</u> (CNS) sometime back reported that the number of deacons, priests and bishops increased in 2010, while the number of women in religious orders declined, according to Vatican statistics. At the end of 2010, the worldwide Catholic population reached 1.196 billion.

The percentage of Catholics declined slightly in South America from 28.54% to 28.34% and dropped considerably in Europe from 24.05% to 23.83%. The Vatican said the number of bishops in the world increased from 5,065 to 5,104; the number of priests went from 410,593 to 412,236, increasing everywhere except Europe. The number of permanent deacons reported -- 39,564 -- was an increase of more than 1,400 over the previous year. 97.5% of the world's permanent deacons live in the Americas or in Europe.

The number of men joining a religious order showed "a setback," the Vatican said, with an increase of only 436 male religious worldwide in 2010. The number of women in religious orders fell by more than 7,000 in 2010, despite showing a 2% increase in both Asia and Africa. At the end of the year, Catholic women's orders had 721,935 members. The number of seminarians around the world showed continued growth, from 117,978 at the end of 2009 to 118,990 at the end of 2010.

With these figures we all need to pray for vocations and to support those who are called. We need also to nurture the lives of those already in ministry by supporting them with our prayer, pastoral cooperation and good example.
