### PARISH PRIEST IN 'UKRAINE ROBBERY'?

Dear Parishioners, I believe you had a good Easter. I thank you all for your prayerful celebration and participation since Ash Wednesday which culminated in the proclamation of the Lord's resurrection. I thank those who were directly involved, namely the Altar Servers, the choir, lectors and Eucharistic ministers.

The cleanliness and beauty of our church captures almost every eye of the visitors who come to pray with us. From time to time, I hear comments from visitors and of course many of them tend to thank the Parish Priest. However the truth is that the cleanliness of this church is done by those people who volunteer their time to come and do the cleaning. For this reason, I would like to thank all those parishioners who cleaned the church. May God bless all of us who cherish St. Mary's as our spiritual home.

On Wednesday 23<sup>rd</sup> April soon after Easter, a good number of you received an e-mail at 8:25am with the following message

"I'm sorry for not informing you about my trip, Am in Ukraine with my family during the Easter it was a place fun to be ,but unfortunately we got mugged at the hotel park were stayed, All cash an credit cards were stolen off me. Wondering if i get a loan from you in getting settling my hotel bills and get back your money as soon as i get back home. Please do get back to me immediately to let you know the easiest way to get the fund to us."

This was the work of internet gangsters who hacked into my internet mail box. If you analyse the language and lifestyle portrayed even an ordinary person immediately notices that this is not the kind of lifestyle that the parish priest is living at the moment. I wish to commend you for so many telephone calls that I have received from those who got the email and for the advices you gave. Former parishioners sent their spontaneous warnings from as far as Canada, Ireland and Australia. Surely you love your parish priest!

All my contacts were lost therefore I could not contact many of you to ask you to ignore the scam. The Parish Priest has not been in Ukraine at any time, he is safe and doing his work. I will be pleased to get your contacts again. A good parish priest yearns to keep in touch with his people.

Please take care when you are on line, we are vulnerable in so many ways.

Is any parishioner sick or in hospital? Please inform the Parish Priest or one of the Sisters. It is important that Catholics on admission to hospital tell their religion to be recorded and request a visit from the Catholic Chaplain.

#### **Pastoral**

This behavior does not reflect that we believe: Holy Week and Easter liturgies are very long and exhausting for everyone including the priests. There is no short-cut to the prayers. I noticed some people who walked out of the church on Good Friday as if in protest against the service being too long! What a pity that they missed the veneration of the Cross! How completely dependent we are on that Holy Cross, for the grace of God's friendship, for forgiveness of sin for hope of heaven here after! If this was done by pagans, I would understand but the people who left the church were some of the most trusted by the parish priest which left him heart broken. When you go to church, try to know what you are doing and before whom you are standing – God. Faith is reflected in behavior.

**RCIA:** or Rite of Christian Initiation of Adults is a program that aims at instructing people who are of mature age and do not belong to the Catholic Church to be initiated into the Christian faith as understood and practiced by the Catholics. The program starts in September of each year and ends on Easter vigil. If you are baptized in other Christian denominations and you would like to be received into full communion with the Catholic Church, or if you are not baptized at all and you would wish to, please contact the parish priest.

<u>His Grace Archbishop Bernard Longley</u> has written a letter to thank all the Catholics of the archdiocese for the generous contribution of £30,000 when Cardinal Vincent Nichols visited the diocese on March  $30^{th}$  2014. *'The response in excess of £30,000 was immensely generous'* he wrote. The Cardinal has in turn donated this money to the Christian community in the Holy Land and he will decide which specific project that will benefit from it.
