THEY DEPEND ON YOU!

I received a telephone call from one of the missions where I worked as a missionary several years ago to inform me of the sad news of the death of the village timekeeper. Children were in tears because the timekeeper had survived several attempts on his life and he had also saved the lives of many of his offspring by alerting the people whenever there was a raid in the village either on land or in the air. His fidelity had brought prosperity in the village; children loved him; he woke them up every morning between 4:00am and 5:00am warning them that it was almost morning; it was time to wake up and go to school. Obedient to the village time-keeper improved school standards that both pupils and teachers adored him.

Misfortune struck when a pack of mongoose invaded the village last Saturday about 10:00am when children were in schools and all people were in the fields. The only person at home was the village timekeeper. He had averted an eagle raid from the sky only to discover that his entire family was surrounded by hungry mongoose. The village timekeeper was able to defend the family that none of them was lost to the mongoose or to the eagle unfortunately he lost his own life.

I'm talking about the village cockerel. In a traditional African setting the cock is so important that many people depend on it to know the time to wake up or to start the journey. The death of an old cock can be a cause of concern and a distortion of people's programs.

As your parish priest, I have a habit of thanking you for the work you do for the parish or for being present at Sunday Mass; someone upon being thanked replied "Oh I don't do much" Remember that we need not do much so as to contribute to a good or a bad cause, whatever we do big or small matters. There are many people who gain strength and support from those little things just like the crow of a village cock.

There is something unique in our parish and it is this: we might not know the names of every person, we might not recall their faces at once, yet we love to welcome each other and to talk to one another every time when we come to Mass. What builds a parish is the desire to belong to and the feeling of belonging. The season of Lent challenges us to encourage one another to persevere in the faith. Being a Christian is like riding a bicycle the moment you stop peddling, you will eventually fall off! It is good for other people to have the confidence that they can depend on us just as villagers in one place were confident to depend on that faithful timekeeper the COCK

Mothering Sunday is celebrated today, make no mistake it is Christian in origin and Christian in its manner of celebration. In the 16th century, Christians visited their mother church, the main church or cathedral of the area on the 4th week of Lent. This was either the church of ones' baptism or more often the nearest Cathedral. Anyone who did this was commonly said to have gone "a-mothering", In later times, Mothering Sunday became a day when domestic servants were given a day off to visit their mother church, usually with their own mothers and other family members. It was often the only time that whole families could gather together. Business people inspired by profit hijacked this once Christian celebration and made it a day when they can entertain their mothers with lavish foods and expensive trips.
