I WISH I WAS A MOTHER:

When I was a novice the first 30 minutes of class everyday were spent reading the lives of saints. At the end of the week, novices took turns to narrate to the others the life of the saint they have read about. I enjoyed the story of St. John Vianney, patron of Parish Priests (1786-1859) whose memory of sanctity will be celebrated on Tuesday 4th Aug.

John Vianney was a religious personality of unusual force. From this man there emanated an influence which cannot be overlooked and the results of which cannot be contested. Where did the man get all this? It was from his mother who was a woman of great piety that she led him into the way of religion at an early age. He was a good-natured boy. He once said:

"I owe a debt to **my mother!** Virtues go easily from mothers into the hearts of their children, who willingly do what they see a mother doing. When I was young, I did not know evil. I was first acquainted with it in the confessional, from the mouths of sinners."

Try to look back and see, none of us here learned the art of self-discipline, respect of self and of others from the classrooms and lecture halls. It all started with the humble lessons of a mother either as we sat on her laps or as we saw her devotedly preparing meals in the kitchen. A mother is the most influential teacher in the life of a child, therefore when St. John Vianney says that he owes a debt to his mother, it is so great a challenge to every mother to examine herself to see whether their children could speak the same about them.

This weekend Fr. David Burke is with us to celebrate his Mass of thanksgiving to God for the gift of his ordination. I'm sure that his parents played a great part in his vocation especially as they encouraged him to serve Mass here and made sure that he was on time to carry out that ministry. A vocation cannot grow where good example is lacking.

Going back to Fr. John Vianney he achieved as parish priest of Ars, something which many priests would like to have but which is scarcely granted to any. He brought sanctity in the life of his people. When a priest attacks chronic spiritual disorders and popular vices, he attracts opposition. But if he is determined not to lose his soul, as soon as any disorder arises in the parish, he must trample underfoot all human considerations, or any fear of contempt and hatred.

God has given unimaginable authority to a mother; she is the only teacher who without pen and paper wields teaching authority unparalleled on earth. How I wish I was a mother.
