## WHEN YOU MEET A PRIEST TAKE HIM AS GOD'S GIFT TO YOU:

Sometime back I mentioned to you how embarrassed I was in the company of young people. They were talking about something that sounded new to me but they seemed to be readily at home with it. It was "*WhatsApp*". I know that many of us still do not know what it is. Well, I tried to know what it is and I made sure that I got connected. Through that internet facility, someone sent to me an interesting message about a priest. It was interesting and reflecting on the lives of many priests I have come to know, I came to discover that the Catholic priest is the only person who does not possess his own life or its activities it is all meant *for others*. This is what she wrote:

"You the priests are the image and the likeness of God. With you the morning awakens with the call to rise, **not for you but always for others** 

God handpicked you from a myriad of souls; moulded you since you were conceived to prepare you for a journey, **not for you but always for others**.

God blessed you with wisdom to use, to give form to his plans and to love to carry them out, **not for you but always for others**.

When I read this I felt I should share it with you too. Please pray for all the priests. I also pray that as a Christian you may learn to dedicate your life in service of others. What profit does a man get to possess the whole world in service of his ego?
