WHEN THE VISION IS LOST, THE MEANS EMPLOYED ARE USELESS

Today's Sunday readings evoke within us the invitation to realise that we have been chosen by God to live a holy life in this world. The second reading taken from St. Paul's letter to the Ephesians is an ancient Christian hymn, let us call it a poem which was recited by the Christians to emphasise their special position in the pagan world. God had chosen them to know his hidden purpose fulfilled in the crucified Christ. When you know that you have been chosen, you take every opportunity to fulfil the purpose for which you are chosen.

In the first reading the prophet Amos was denounced by the priest of Bethel which was the royal sanctuary. Amos was not a known prophet at the palace, he did not even belong to any of the groups of the prophets, he was a poor farmer in the countryside owning few sycamore trees and sheep. God chose him to prophesy to Israel, this awareness could not make him be silenced by his critics.

These days people's actions are controlled and often manipulated by public opinion. What others say, can be a reason either to carry on or to give up. Good actions are omitted because public opinion does not like them. In the response that Amos gave to his critics, "It is Yahweh who said: Go prophesy to my people Israel" he teaches us that what God commands of us to do we must do.

It is not unusual to hear people say: "I don't want to hear your religion or I don't want to hear your preaching. Don't mind or give up, the prophet Amos was told exactly the same, who are you then to expect welcome words to the faith you profess or to the gospel you preach?"

The Gospel reading reminds us that Jesus has called you by name and he has given you a mission to do: cure the sick, cleanse lepers, cast out devils. He told his disciples to move about almost empty handed except they had to have a stick in hand, no bread, no haversack no money or spare clothing. Why? When we place too much attention on material possessions, we can easily be distracted. It was also to emphasize the point that the church has the duty to meet the material needs of those the Lord sends to them.

I wish to thank those Christians who meet the material needs of their priests, some provide food, others clothing, some give their time or money itself. These provisions make the work of the priests easier since all they worry about is the preaching of the word.

As you return home today, I give you some homework. First, go and behave like Amos. Don't give up the mission God has given you in this life.

Second: always be conscious that God has chosen you to be a Christian in this world practice your faith by following Jesus always.

Third, Jesus has given you his authority over evil just as he gave to his apostles. Do not be afraid. We must never lose the vision of who we are and the mission that God has given us to do. If you want to be a Christian, you must constantly be conscious of being one.

Baptism Course: families with children to be baptised are asked to attend series of preparation talks. The first session starts on Monday 12th July at 6:00pm in the parish hall. If you intend to attend these sessions, you must keep to the time: (six is six not five past six). Late comers will have the booking of baptism deferred.

FHC & Confirmation preparation classes: This announcement goes to the parents whose children studying in non-Catholic schools and have reached the age of receiving FHC and Confirmation please contact me or the sisters so that we can arrange catechism classes for them.

Courses offered by Maryvale Institute. It is exciting to be able to launch its first 'summer school' programme, which will run during the last two weeks of July! The four courses are – Introduction to Latin and Evangelisation & Family Vocation (Week 1), with Introduction to Ancient Greek and Environment Matters! (Week 2). To fit with busy schedules, each course lasts a week but is based around a 2 hour morning lecture and interactive session, followed by work throughout the day with a specifically designed workbook in students' own time and at their own pace.

The workbook will contain a variety of activities, reading, further practice in the language skills, reflection, and prayer opportunities and will lead into a further 1 ½ hour tutorial and Q&A session, with a chance to chat to fellow at students, later in the afternoon/early evening. Students who complete the workbook and submit this for marking/review will be provided with a Certificate of Completion from Maryvale.

Feast of St. Benedict– Patron St. of our Parish. St. Benedict was a religious reformer who lived in Italy in the late 400s and early 500s. He is known as the “father of Western monasticism,” having established a Rule that would become the norm for innumerable Christian monks and nuns. He died of fever on 21st March 547 AD. He is the patron saint of Europe.

First Holy Communion: I wish to congratulate the children of our parish community who received their First Holy Communion yesterday. It was a great day indeed for them and for their families. Make your home in Jesus Christ as he has made his in you.

Act now to stop abortion up to birth being introduced to England and Wales on Monday. An extreme amendment to the Police, Crime, Sentencing and Courts Bill will introduce **abortion on demand, for any reason, up to birth (including sex-selective abortion)** to England and Wales on Monday tabled by Dame Diana Johnson MP. Sex-selective abortion predominantly impacts baby girls, fundamentally undermining all steps that have been taken to ensure equality between both sexes. To ensure that women are treated as being of equal value to men in the UK, it is not good to permit sex-selective abortion to take place up to birth in any part of the UK. The proposed law change is radically out of step with the opinions of women on abortion, 91% of women agree that gender-selective abortion should be explicitly banned by the law. Please contact your MP not to vote in favour of that bill if you can.
