ARE YOU SAVED?

This question takes my memory back to the late 1970s when I first encountered Christians of non-Catholic tradition at a Bus Station in Masaka Town, in Uganda. One smart woman asked me if I was saved! I did not understand her question and so I did not answer her. I later understood that the question of salvation is central to our Christian faith so it is one worth revisiting all the time.

In his letter to the Ephesians, St. Paul provides a useful answer, 'When we were dead through our sins, God brought us to life with Christ – it is through grace that you have been saved – and raised us up with him and gave us a place with him in heaven, in Christ Jesus' (Eph. 2: 5).

Salvation has two prongs. It entails being saved from danger. For example, hostages in the circle of terrorists are in danger of being killed or harmed at any time if their demands are not met, and a successful rescue mission will save the hostages from the terror of evil. However, it is not enough to be taken away from the danger, it is also important to flourish with fullness of life. Fullness of human life means an experience of utmost happiness, joy and contentment.

Salvation, which is complete flourishing of the human person, entails a personal embracing of the love of God. This is because, as creatures, we come from God and can get our ultimate fulfilled flourishing only in God.

Our Lord Jesus Christ provides us with the experience of salvation which God grants freely to all, but can be freely accepted or rejected.

Thus to the question, 'Are you saved?' Each person upon reflection should give a relevant answer according to each ones response. It is also important to note that our salvation cannot be complete while still in this world, since we continue to struggle with sin and its ugly effects.

As we journey through Lent, let us focus our attention to God who invites us to embrace his love. Remember: God loved the world so much that he gave his only Son, so that everyone who believes in him may not be lost but may have eternal life (John, 3: 16). God saves us because he loves us.
