## **Parish Newsletter— 5th Sunday of Easter- 10th to 17th May 2020**

### **THE FAILURE OF YOUR PRIEST TO FULFIL HIS DUTY MIGHT BE BECAUSE OF YOU**

Since the lockdown, you might not have an idea how families have rediscovered the gift of faith. I mentioned sometime ago, that by closing churches, the Devil thought that the battle was won not knowing that God was instead opening a church in every house where every person would become a preacher, or a leader of prayer or a biblical commentator. It is not unusual after reading the Bible in the home, to hear a child making such good comment about what he/she has understood. This is something we should feel proud of and which we should carry with us into the parish church when God calls us to congregate again.

The First Reading has had a challenging question for us: what would you consider as what should be the priority of your parish priest? Probably as a priest I should also ask, what should I consider to be the priority of my bishop or of my Religious Superior? The other question is why is he not able to fulfil that duty? The Apostles addressed the early Christians: *brothers it would not be right for us to neglect the preaching of the word of God and become distributors of food.* They were calling on the Christians to realise that important as it was, the distribution of food was not their duty. They called on them to choose amongst themselves men of good reputation to take on all those temporal duties so that the Apostles could devote themselves entirely to *prayer and to the preaching of the Word of God.*

Let us go back to our question: what do you consider to be what should be the priority of your parish priest? Sometimes Christians complain that their priest is not doing this or that. They complain to the bishop ooh the father has ruined our parish, the church roof is licking, the floor is broken the church compound is all but a bush! They forget that the parish priest is not a roofer, is not a builder he is not a gardener. The parish priest is not a banker, he is not ordained or trained to count the Sunday collection or to take it to the bank. *“You brothers must select from amongst yourselves people of good reputation to do these duties so that your priests may devote themselves to prayer and to the preaching of the Word of God”* That is the duty of the priest. When you find your priest doing something outside the preaching of the word of God, when the priest has little time for prayer or for the celebration of the sacraments, you should examine yourself to see how much time you devote to the carrying out of those duties that have taken over his ministry.

In the second reading St. Peter reminds us that Christians no matter where they live, what jobs they do or what social status they find themselves in, they are a chosen race, a royal priesthood, a consecrated nation a people set apart. If this is the case, it means that God has distributed different tasks. The duty of every priest is to devote himself to prayer and to the preaching of the word. After Corona virus pandemic we want to hear Christians telling their bishops that their priests are not praying enough, or preaching enough instead of ooh the priest has not fixed the roof, has not cut the grass or covered the potholes in the compound.

Anyhow, let us keep in mind that assisting your priests in the daily running of the parish gives him time to devote himself to prayer and to the preaching of the Word of God. Going to Mass is not enough we need to get involved in other practical way.

**YOU ARE MOST WELCOME** to our Parish Church. If it is your first time here or probably you have been here before, your presence with us at this moment at our community worship is greatly appreciated. Our Parish Church is the second to be built in Coventry after the Protestant Reformation. It was built in 1893, the pews have never moved since then! Our Musical Pipe Organ was inaugurated in 1898, it was the best of its kind at the time. Our Parish has had eleven Parish priests since 1889, the present one being a Religious Missionary from the Institute of Apostles of Jesus in Uganda. Our Parish welcomes and promotes the initiatives taken by everyone for the building up and sustenance of our faith community.
