THE ANGELUS AND ENGLAND 'THE DOWRY OF MARY'

Some of you will have visited the 'Dowry Exhibition' in St Chad's Cathedral in June 2019, when the statue of Our Lady of Walsingham together with the replica of the Holy House of Nazareth were on display. Between 2018 and 2020 the exhibition will have visited every Catholic Cathedral in England. England has been known as the 'Dowry of Mary' for up to 1,000 years, going back to the time of St Edward the Confessor (1042-1066), in whose reign the replica of the Holy House of Nazareth was built. In 1381 on the Feast of Corpus Christi, King Richard 2nd dedicated England to Mary as 'her dowry.'

For those cultures where dowry is paid in marriage, it is something so important and serious as it brings two families into unbreakable bond of unity. England to be named "Dowry of Mary" points to the privileged position that our country once enjoyed in the eyes of the Blessed Mother. King Richard 2nd went on pilgrimage to Walsingham twice. So for 1,000 years, Walsingham has been the great shrine of prayer and pilgrimage for the people of this country in honour of the Blessed Virgin Mary.

On 29 March, 2020, England will be rededicated as the 'Dowry of Mary.' This will happen in Westminster Cathedral, in Walsingham, in every Catholic Cathedral, in every parish and in as many homes as possible. We are asked to prepare ourselves spiritually for the rededication by praying the Angelus every day after our parish Masses. The traditional times for the Angelus are 6am (or when you get out of bed), 12 noon and 6pm. The Angelus recalls 'some essential moments in the History of Salvation, reminding us of Mary's 'Yes' to the Angel Gabriel, which undid Eve's 'No' in the Garden of Eden.' We profess our faith in 'The Word, who was made flesh, and dwelt amongst us,' that Word is Jesus Christ.

In the Angelus we pray that through the prayers of Mary we too may be made worthy to obtain the promises of Christ, who through his Death and Resurrection has obtained for us the eternal destiny to which each and everyone of us is called in Christ.

The Angelus is a beautiful personal and family prayer. How important it is for parents and children to learn it by heart and say it everyday!

YOU ARE MOST WELCOME to our Parish Church. If it is your first time here or probably you have been here before, your presence with us at this moment at our community worship is greatly appreciated. Our Parish Church is the second to be built in Coventry after the Protestant Reformation. It was built in 1893, the pews have never moved since then! Our Musical Pipe Organ was inaugurated in 1898, it was the best of its kind at the time. Our Parish has had eleven Parish priests since 1889, the present one being a Religious Missionary from the Institute of Apostles of Jesus in Uganda. Our Parish welcomes and promotes the initiatives taken by everyone for the building up and sustenance of our faith community.
