#### FAMILY THANKSGIVING DAY 15th SEPTEMBER

Human beings hold a record for being the most vulnerable of all creatures from conception to adulthood. It is beyond proof that while many animals and birds in the wild can survive after birth without parental care, no human being can survive without parental (family) care. When a child is conceived, the baby in the womb is not left to nature to take its course, the mother takes many precautions. Nursing and protecting the offspring is a laborious work sometimes of one parent or of both.

Recalling the support that we have received through the families that God chose for our existence, all of us have something to thank God for. Try to think of the people that God has given you in your family, parents, children, grandchildren uncles, nieces and nephews. Try to think about the house that your family calls its home, when many people are homeless! Some families are in deep trouble, constant fights, abusive parents, disrespectful children etc...., but God keeps yours united. We have been so blessed though our families since none of us would be here without one. If your family is still united, then you have something to thank God for.

I will appreciate whatever you would wish to do as a gesture of your thanksgiving to God for your family. I pray that this family thanksgiving event may continue to be celebrated in the future. Jesus, Mary and Joseph keep our family together AMEN.
