Of course, I want to! Be Cured.

In the past two Sundays, reading extracts from the Gospel of Mark, we encountered Jesus who performed miracles: casting out demons and healing the sick. He did this because of his kindness to those who were vulnerable due to sickness and those who cried out to him for help.

Today we have Jesus who healed a man of leprosy, a disease that was associated with ritual uncleanliness, stigma, social exclusion, and discrimination. It was very humbling to have leprosy. In the Book of Leviticus, chapters 13 and 14, are about the strict rules that were imposed on lepers. It was the role of the priest to verify cases of leprosy, pronounce them so, and order their exclusion; likewise, the priest verified their healing and accepted the sacrifice of thanksgiving for their healing.

The leper was to live differently from other members of the community, they were to wear torn clothes, have unkept hair, and cry out 'Unclean, Unclean!' so that no one got too close to them. The regulations indicate how much leprosy affected an individual's dignity, social life, and their personal identity.

With that background we have an insight into the feelings of the man, whose name we are not told, who came to Jesus, and pleaded on his knees: 'If you want to, you can cure me'. We learn that Jesus felt sorry for him, stretched out his hand, touched him, and said: 'Of course, I want to! Be cured'. At once he was cured. That is how powerful Jesus is!

How restoring to hear the words of the Master of Creation telling the same to us! In the first place, he does not avoid the leper; he is beyond contamination; he touched him to restore his dignity and remove the stigma that was associated with the disease.

To be healed by Jesus, we must be humble enough to accept our need for healing. There is no human condition that Jesus cannot heal. As we start the Lenten Season, let us open our lives in humility and sincerity of heart to accept God's healing touch and particularly in the Sacraments of Penance and the Eucharist.
