

THIS IS THE ONLY SACRAMENT THAT PROMISES ETERNAL LIFE:

From the beginning of Christianity the followers of Jesus were persecuted, although they had done nothing wrong. As a matter of fact, Christians were the most submissive and respectful people towards the emperor. They believed that the authority exercised by political leaders namely the emperor and his governors, was given by God himself. Therefore, to obey them was a sign of obedience to God. But as a matter of fact, there is no group of people that were consistently persecuted like the Christians. We know that from the year 64AD to the year 317AD, Christians were persecuted throughout the Roman Empire for one reason or the other. No single reason united their persecutors than what we celebrate today the Body and Blood of Jesus Christ.

The early Christians went to the temple and continued to observe some Mosaic traditions, however, they used to assemble in their private houses for the breaking of bread in obedience to Jesus who commanded them to do it in memory of him. At such assemblies, bread was blessed, broken and shared by all present. A cup with the fruit of the vine was blessed too, and shared by all present. By doing so, they were participating in the Lords supper. They were "eating and drinking the blood of the Lord", who at the Last Supper, had decreed that the bread had become his body, and the wine had become his blood.

The ignorance of the pagans concerning the meaning and interpretation of Christian celebrations, led them to accuse them of introducing cannibalism. 'We know that this group of people go to the temple like all other Jews, but later, they gather in their private homes to eat the body and to drink the blood of someone called Jesus'. This accusation united the whole empire in earnest persecution of Christians including their sympathisers. This is what ignorance does!

In our own time, it is not difficult to find Christians who are ignorant of what the Eucharist is. For some, it is a little piece of bread, for others it is something we receive because others are receiving! Yet for others, it has no meaning at all! There is yet another grave ignorance: that some Christians have no longing for it or others receive it even though they know that they are in a mortal sin. This is very dangerous not only to the persons receiving it but to the community of believers as well. St. Paul reminded the Christians of Corinth to recollect themselves before participating in the Lords supper because anyone who ate the body and drank the blood of the Lord unworthily would be eating and drinking his own condemnation (1Cor.11:27-29).

On this Solemnity of the Body and Blood of Jesus, let us deepen our understanding of the Eucharist and our love of it. This is the only sacrament that carries a promise with it: "whoever eats my body and drinks my blood, will have life and I will raise him up on the last day" (Jn 6:53-58). I wish you all a blessed feast.

Gospel Reflection

Today, we are celebrating the Feast of the Body and Blood of Christ. This special Feast is held in remembrance of Jesus who gave His life for our salvation and commanded us to celebrate the Sacrament of the Holy Eucharist in his memory. The Feast of Corpus Christi reminds us that we as Christians possess an immense treasure. Jesus himself, through the Eucharist, grants to us the most powerful experience of intimacy possible within our earthly existence. In his teaching Jesus said, "I am the living bread that came down from Heaven. Whoever eats of this bread will live forever; and the bread that I will give for the life of the world is my flesh." With these words Jesus offered his own life for the sins of the humanity. Every Eucharist is a unique celebration. When the celebrant takes a little piece of unleavened bread and repeats the words that Jesus spoke at the Last Supper, "This is my body", and when he takes a small of amount of wine in a chalice and says, "This is my blood", the bread is no longer bread and the wine is no longer wine. At every Holy Sacrifice of the Mass, we participate in a marvelous miracle, the miracle called Transubstantiation. This is truly God's gift to us. Thus Eucharist is a gift, not just to be adored and revered, but also to be consumed, digested and lived by every Christian.

MATTERS OF IMPORTANCE

Month of Sacred Heart: As we enter the month of June we are reminded that this is the month devoted to the sacred Heart of Jesus. Let us place our trust in the most Sacred Heart of Jesus.

Corpus Christi procession, : starting at St Anne's Church in Coventry at 3pm on Sunday 18th June, processing to Corpus Christi Church. First Holy Communion children are particularly invited - and they are asked to wear their Holy Communion attire and lead the procession for us. It would help if a teacher or two could come with the children. This is the first time since COVID that we are trying a deanery Corpus Christi procession, which was part of our Coventry tradition until then, so please help us make it a good restart.

<u>Baptism preparation session</u>: will be on 24th June at 6.00pm in the Lady's Chapel. Parents with children to be baptised are welcome to attend the session.

<u>DEANERY VOCATIONS MASS:</u> This will be celebrated at St Thomas More, Coventry, at 7pm on Tues 13th June. You are welcome to come and pray for Vocations to priestly and religious life in the Church.

Evening Mass at St. Osburgh's: There will now be a Sunday evening Mass at St Osburg's at 6.00pm. This is a Mass to serve the whole Deanery, as there has not been a Sunday evening Mass in Coventry for the last couple of years. We hope that this will be a helpful option for people. All welcome

Achieving our Vision Together: Archbishop Bernard Longley has released a video inviting you, in our parishes, clusters and deaneries to reflect together on our great gift of faith, and as with the Synodal pathway, to meet and look to our future. Archbishop Bernard asks us to look, within our parishes, clusters and deaneries, at how we can share our resources and to look at what we are called to do within: Evangelisation, Formation, Liturgy and worship, Social outreach. He asks us how we can more effectively follow that pattern with the mandate given to us by the Lord Himself to be the church in any given place.

<u>Day for Life 2023:</u> Next Sunday 18 June. This year's theme is 'Listen to Her' and focuses on post-abortion trauma and the impact of abortion primarily on women, but also men and others. Often the voices of women who have had an abortion are silent in Church and in society. The hope is that this will help break this silence and offer further opportunities for healing and reconciliation.
