THE SUNDAY OBLIGATION IS REINSTATED:

A beautiful hallmark of the Catholic faith is the profound desire to participate in the Holy Mass and share in the Eucharist. We do so with deep gratitude and joy. The Eucharist gives the Church her identity. "The Eucharist makes the Church, and the Church makes the Eucharist." It enables us to worship God, to support each other on our journey of faith, and to be a visible sign of faith in the world. It is our fundamental Christian duty is to worship God who has revealed himself in the mystery of the Most Holy Trinity, by participating in the celebration of Mass. Attending Mass on Sundays and Holy Days is the greatest of all privileges, sometimes referred to as "the Sunday Obligation."

Since the beginning of the Covid pandemic, until the present time, the bishops shared with us their judgment that the situation of the last two years has meant that the Sunday Obligation was impeded and had needed to be fulfilled in other ways. We thank God that this situation has now changed. The pressing challenges of the pandemic have lessened significantly. Most people have resumed the wide range of normal activities, no longer restricted by the previous Covid measures. The bishops, therefore, believe that the reasons which had prevented Catholics from attending Mass on Sundays and Holy Days of Obligation no longer apply.

Some members of our congregations may not feel safe enough to return to Mass. It is the understanding of the Church that when the freedom of any Catholic to attend Mass in person is impeded for a serious reason, because of situations such as ill health, care for the sick or legitimate fear, this is not a breach of the Sunday Obligation. Catholics have benefitted during these difficult times from the online streaming of Mass and other services. "Virtual viewing" of Mass online does not fulfil the Sunday Obligation. It may, however, be a source of continual spiritual comfort to those who cannot attend Mass in person, for example those who are elderly and sick, for whom the obligation does not apply. In this context, they recognise gratefully the ministry of those who administer Holy Communion to the elderly, sick and housebound.

The priests, the religious and lay faithful have served with dedication and distinction throughout this pandemic. In the Holy Sacrifice of the Mass, the Lord's Supper, the Lord Jesus entrusted to us the precious gift of Himself. We are a Eucharistic people for whom attendance at Mass is essential.

Starting with Pentecost, the bishops direct that all Catholics return to attending Mass in person. As the Church needs the witness of the presence of each person, so too each believer needs to journey in faith and worship with their fellow disciples.

Let us return home with great faith and hope that God who created us, who has saved us and has made us a holy people, is always with us on our pilgrimage to him.
