# LESSONS ON WISDOM

There is a sense in which all humans are wise, even babies have that natural wisdom that befits their age and inspires their choices. That sense of wisdom grows and matures as one interacts with lived experiences. We could, therefore, argue that the more experienced one is the wiser they are. Sociologists characterise that as common wisdom. The parable of the ten bridesmaids presents two levels of wisdom among the five who were amateurs, endowed with the common wisdom, and the others who were more experienced, who had a higher sense of foresight, true wisdom.

The more experienced took their lamps with flasks of oil to use in the night at the arrival of the bridegroom, the amateurs carried their lamps but did carry the oil, they followed the common wisdom. Perhaps, if they had in humility sought advice from the more experienced, they would have been guided and got more sensible.

The parable invites us to introspect and check how we make important decisions. Biblical wisdom challenges us to consider uncomfortable themes of life as we go about our life. To make wise decisions requires humility, patience, prayer, carrying the daily cross, and a foresight to consider the immediate and distant future that includes themes of personal death, judgment, heaven, and hell. With those distant themes in mind, one is likely to be more careful when going about daily life.

The Book of Wisdom assures us that there is no excuse for any reasonable person to remain in ignorance or choose foolishly, because channels of wisdom are accessible to all. We read, 'Wisdom herself searches everywhere for those who are worthy of her, benevolently appearing to them on their ways' (Wis. 6:16).

Dear Brothers and Sisters, how much time do you dedicate to a search for true wisdom as you go about your daily life? How much time do you avail to instruct the doubtful to live wisely?
