### IF YOU DO NOT WONDER YOU CANNOT BE THANKFUL

St. Peter writing to all Christians said: "It was not any cleverly invented myths that we were repeating when we brought you the knowledge of the power and the coming of our Lord Jesus Christ" 2Peter 1: Today in the gospel, the three disciples for a brief moment touched the beauty and light of heaven and tasted the joy of paradise on Mt. Tabor . The exclamation of Peter reveals that beauty when he says: "It is wonderful for us to be here." Adoration and worship of God begins by realising how privileged we are, to be where we are, to see what we see and to hear what we hear. Yes it is wonderful for us to be here!

The disciples seeing Jesus in his heavenly glory, did not take away the reality of the cross but it helped them to understand that the cross was not the final destiny. They understood that it was a passage to glory for Jesus and for his followers, therefore bearing it courageously was part of God's plan.

The gospel reminds us what a feeling we should have when we spend some time in prayer, it becomes another Mt. Tabour for us because at that moment, like Jesus we are praying; God literary comes down to us, we are in his presence, he speaks to us, he listens to us and he transforms our life. Prayer should not be a burden or an obligation, but a joyful encounter with God who transforms our lives.

The voice that came from the cloud, told the disciples and tells us today to listen to Jesus. It tells us not to put our trust in anything or in anybody but in Jesus. But what does Jesus teach us during this Lenten Season, he asks us to love one another, to forgive each other, to pray so that we do not give in to temptation, to be men and women of peace, to show mercy to others, to hunger and thirst for what is right, to take up our crosses everyday and follow him, to welcome strangers. So when the voice of the Father tells us to listen to his beloved son, there are many things which we need to practice in our personal and community living.

St. Paul was a man who, having understood the love of Jesus was also given the grace to do whatever it took to listen to him. In the second reading he sets himself as someone we can imitate, because like anyone here, Paul was a sinful man who even persecuted the church. Once he discovered his life in Christ he called on his Christians to "be united in following my rule of life", and his rule of life was Jesus Christ himself.

As you return home today, while we contemplate on how wonderful for us to be here in the presence of God, let us remember the suffering people of the world particularly in Ukraine and in all those parts which never make headlines in the media. We must realise that this world is not our home, God did not create us to stay on planet earth forever, we are just walking through life. St. Paul has again put it plainly in the second reading: "our homeland is in heaven" Therefore, greed, thirst for power and the misery that man inflicts on man is an offence to God, and one day, either in this life or in the next an account will be demanded by God. Return to your homes, thanking God for who you are and for what you have. If you do not wonder, you cannot be truly thankful. Like Peter let us wake up each day and say "It is wonderful for us to be here".
