OUR LOCAL SAINTS MAKE HEAVEN COME CLOSER



As we celebrate this Mass, something is taking place on earth specifically in St. Peter's Square Rome as the Church recognises and declares the heroic life of holiness in **John Henry Newman**, a man from our own diocese of Birmingham, born 21st February 1801 and died on 11th August 1890.

He was born and brought up in London in an Anglican family. When he felt the call to serve God, it became natural that he trained as an Anglican priest. He was drawn to the High-Church tradition of Anglicanism. He became known as a leader of, and an able polemicist for the Oxford Movement,

an influential and controversial grouping of Anglicans who wished to return to the Church of England many Catholic beliefs and liturgical rituals which the so called Reformers had thrown out of the Church. In this, the movement had some success.

In 1845 Newman, joined by some but not all of his followers, officially left the Church of England and his teaching post at Oxford University. He was received into the Catholic Church on 9 October 1845 by Dominic Barberi, an Italian Passionist, at the college in Littlemore. He was quickly ordained as a catholic priest and continued as an influential religious leader, based in Birmingham. In 1879, he was created a cardinal by Pope Leo XIII in recognition of his services to the cause of the Catholic Church in England. As a convert to Catholicism and later as Cardinal Newman was an important and controversial figure in the religious history of England in the 19th century.

John Henry Newman is the first English person to be canonised in almost 50 years the last canonisation in England and Wales was in 1970 when Pope Paul VI made 40 English and Welsh martyrs saints. They had been executed under Reformation laws. The canonisation of someone from our own community brings heaven closer since we realize that each one of us can make it to heaven.

YOU ARE MOST WELCOME to our Parish Church. If it is your first time here or probably you have been here before, your presence with us at this moment at our community worship is greatly appreciated. Our Parish Church is the second to be built in Coventry after the Protestant Reformation. It was built in 1893, the pews have never moved since then! Our Musical Pipe Organ was inaugurated in 1898, it was the best of its kind at the time. Our Parish has had eleven Parish priests since 1889, the present one being a Religious Missionary from the Institute of Apostles of Jesus in Uganda. Our Parish welcomes and promotes the initiatives taken by everyone for the building up and sustenance of our faith community.
