#### HAVE YOUR ANSWERS READY

This Sunday Jesus resolutely prepares his disciples for his departure. The mission given to him by the Father was done, he was sure that the disciples or the Church could go on without his physical presence. Jesus makes a new promise, *I will ask the Father to give you another advocate, to guide you, to strengthen you, to watch over you, the Spirit of truth*.

The promise of the Holy spirit was fulfilled on Pentecost day, and as you know we look forward to Pentecost Sunday, but we should remember that the Holy spirit has always been with the church and with every baptised Christian such that without the guidance of the Holy spirit the Church would not have stood today confessing her faith in Jesus Christ.

In the second reading, St. Peter has taught us that we should always have our answers ready for people who ask us for the hope that we have. In other words, we must know our faith, we must understand fully what we believe, why we believe it. What does your faith mean to you.

Some of the mistakes that we make as baptised Catholics is to follow the crowd, or to do things out of routine. I go to church because I see people going to church, or because we have always done so on this day at that time. Of course it is good to have holy habits, but if you are asked why you believe or why you do these things, you should have the answer. As baptised Catholics, we can do a lot of damage to our faith and to the Church, if we do not have an answer that can either explain our faith to others or when we cannot defend it.

At the time when St. Peter exhorted the early Christians to have their answers ready and to endure punishment even when they have done nothing wrong, Christianity was alien to the pagans. Ignorance created suspicion and suspicion brought about imprisonment and death. So he encouraged them not to stop doing the right thing and do wrong, but to endure suffering if it came to that.

Christians and Catholics in particular, are criticised or even attacked on every side. If they are not attached by fellow Christians, they are attacked by non Christians. If they are not criticized for honouring Mary the Mother of Jesus, they will be criticized for having statues in the church. They are criticised for praying the rosary or for respecting for the Pope. Unfortunately, some Catholics give in to these criticisms and follow strange doctrines. But what does St. Peter say to us: "it is better to suffer for doing something good, than to suffer for doing wrong. It is a blessing for you when people insult you for bearing the name of Christ...because it means that you have the spirit of God resting on you." As a prisoner on Robin Island, Nelson Mandela suffered 27 years of loneliness and isolation. Mahatma Ghandhi suffered starvation almost to death, but none of these caused them bitterness or revenge because they knew what they were suffering for and had their answers ready if someone asked them.

We too must have our answers ready.
