WILL YOU CONSIDER SETTING UP A STANDING ORDER FOR YOUR SUNDAY DONATIONS?

The Diocesan Head of Finance asked Parish Priests to bring this matter to your consideration for the good of our parishes and the diocese in general.

The bank came to see us recently regarding the level of charges we pay across the diocese and as you might expect they are increasing. This is the first time the charges have been reviewed for some 18 years. We were not really therefore in a position to argue too strongly and even if we could have negotiated lower charges with another bank, the costs and potential loss of income from standing order donations of transferring over 300 bank accounts would have vastly outweighed any potential savings.

While in percentage terms the increases are high, in most cases the increases will not be material in monetary terms. *The most notable increase is regarding the processing of cash which the banks simply do not wish to handle*. The revised charges will be reflected in the charges taken by the bank next month.

Full details of the revised tariffs are contained in the attached document (available to your Parish Priest) The message remains that given the increased charges for the cash your parish has to bank whenever this happens, we ask you to consider giving your Sunday offering by Standing Order. This will also cut down on parish administration and counters' time, reduce security risks taking money to the bank and reduce the continued hassle many parishes have with the branch counting machines, which despite what the branch locally may say, the bank cannot actually insist we use. Please talk to your Parish priest about setting up a Standing Order, he will provide you with your parish bank account details. This applies also to those who give their Sunday donations by Gift Aid.

I thank you for your generosity towards the Church without which the diocese would not effectively meet its material and spiritual support. With all good wishes for a peaceful advent season and a Blessed Christmas.
