#### "DO WHATEVER HE TELLS YOU" Jn 2:5.

The Holy Scriptures give equal share of military contributions between the men and women of Israel in the liberation of the people. It is not only Moses, Joshua or King David that liberated Israel, women did their equal share. Deborah was a female military leader, a Judge and Prophet warrior. She led Israel in taking the land of Canaan. She is the only female judge, the only one to be called a prophet, and the only one described as performing a judicial function. There are other matriarchs Sarah, Rebecca, Rachel, Leah, Miriam, Huldah the prophetess, Abigail, Rahab, and Queen Esther who was a diplomat. In these women we are given examples of how their words and actions changed the history of the people.

Today the gospel presents us with another great woman, the greatest commander of all, Mary of Nazareth. I know that many of you will be surprised if I call Mary a 'Commander'. A commander is someone who gives orders. Orders are given to bring about change, to make things better, to win the battle. When orders are given, the commander expects them to be followed. This is exactly what Mary does. The scene is set in Galilee at a wedding party, in a small village called Cana.

During the time of Jesus, weddings were elaborate and took several days it was the talk of the village and many people from the neighbourhood would be present. The wedding we are talking about was a big one. Mary was there, Jesus the famous Rabi was invited too with his entourage the apostles. In the middle of the celebration, the unexpected happened, the guests run out of wine. What an embarrassment that could be! Indeed Mary was the first to be embarrassed, could Jesus have turned up followed by other uninvited guests? What a blunder, "Jesus they have no wine" Jn. 2:3.

The Blessed Mother knows exactly what is lacking in our life and she teaches us today where we can obtain it from. The Blessed Mother is our spokesperson, there is nothing we can ask Jesus through her that we cannot receive. Like our earthly mothers, she is always on the look-out to make sure that we have the provisions necessary for our earthly life and for our heavenly wellbeing.

"Do whatever he tells you" is Marys command to us, in other words she is warning us that the words of Jesus are not to be ignored or matters for discussion. Do whatever he tells you means that there is no alternative to the words of Jesus. Whatever he tells us, that is what we must do. Just as Mary did not expect wedding attendants to do something contrary to what Jesus told them, in the same way she does not expect us to deviate from the words of her son.

As you return home today, let us together take the words of Mary, that beautiful advice of our heavenly Mother to do whatever Jesus tells us. Our parish has been blessed with so many gifts. All of us here are gifts to each other, we are gifts to our families, we are gifts to the church. Let us use our giftedness to encourage one another. The gifts we have do not belong to us they are given to us by God for a purpose. Use God's gifts to build his kingdom here on earth so that you may share in its heavenly blessings.

<u>Peace Sunday:</u> Today, 16th January is the 55th World Day of Peace in England & Wales the 2nd Sunday of Ordinary time. Let us make it a day of prayer for peace and to reflect on the theme Pope Francis has chosen for the annual World Day of Peace: 'Education, work and Dialogue between Generations: Tools for Building Lasting Peace'. "Lord make us channels of your peace".

<u>Updates on Covid19:</u> the Government has announced further amendments to the Covid, self-isolation rules. Anyone who develops symptoms or tests positive for Covid must immediately self-isolate; however, from Monday 17 January, individuals who test positive will be able to leave self-isolation after a further five full days, subject to having two negative Lateral Flow Test results, 24 hours apart. The day symptoms begin, or the individual test positive is day zero. The next day is day one of the isolation period. The rules apply whether the individual is vaccinated or not.
