BE PREPARED TO MEET THE UNEXPECTED

It was a normal burial, except this was a haste one. Passover was approaching, it would be inappropriate to celebrate it with the bodies of condemned men hanging on the crosses. Joseph of Arimathea one of the secret admirers of Jesus, came up with a solution: "I have a tomb preserved for me and for my family. Let us keep the body of Jesus there until the Passover is done" There was some relief, but what about Joseph and his family, for sure they will reclaim their tomb at some point. For the women, led by Mary Magdalene, and Mary the wife of Cleopas, Jesus was buried in a borrowed tomb, once the Passover hours were ended, early in the morning they rushed to the tomb.

The women were met with what they had not away, the tomb was empty! They had no an-not have moved such a huge stone away, the either because they were in hiding for fear of either because they were in hiding for fear of

the Jews. If they were to take it

away, what other safe place could they have buried it? The suspicion falls on the gardener walking about nearby.

The bad news of the empty tomb was immediately reported to the Apostles, who took action by going to the tomb. In order not to attract attention only Peter and another disciple went, the others remained in hiding. The empty tomb did not give there and then, sufficient proof that the resurrection had taken place, it did not point to wild animals to having eaten the body up or that it had been stolen by somebody for simple reason that some cloths had been neatly folded up and kept away. "Till this moment they had failed to understand the teaching of Scripture that he must rise from the dead".

What does this mean? Faith is a journey that we take, and which God himself prepares for us, so that we may eventually discover his saving plan. Jesus expects us to make some efforts to discover who he is and what he wants of us. Jesus died in public view, we heard just the other day of his bitter agony and how having cried in a loud voice, he breathed his last. But he made his resurrection private. No one saw him rise from the dead to life, so that his resurrection and our coming back to life with him on the day of Mercy, may remain as an article of our faith.

The resurrection of Jesus changed human history and gave meaning to human suffering. The events of last week remind us that all of us will at some moment have a Good Friday, but that should not make us lose sight of the dawn of Easter. The gospel extracts this week, will give us various accounts of the appearance of the risen Christ. The role of women in evangelising the timid community, after Jesus appeared to them, is emphasised. Let us always be prepared to meet with the unexpected and to respond to the challenges of our faith with a clear conscience. The resurrection of Jesus will be a stumbling block to unbelievers, but it remains the greatest event of our human history. There will be attempts to deny the Christian message, but like the women and the first Christians, let us remain faithful and constant in our proclamation of the risen Lord.
