FOR SOME PEOPLE, HOMILIES ARE JUST STORIES:

The Parable of the Sower, is one of the stories that Jesus used to demonstrate the privilege God had given to those he called to follow Christ. While the parable of the Prodigal Son demonstrated God's Mercy, and the parable of a Treasure hidden in the land, shown the supreme advantage of following Jesus, the Parable of the Sower, teaches us how easily we can ignore the grace of God at work in us due to many cares of life.

The Parable of the Sower is essentially talking about the generosity of God. Jesus begins by appealing to the imagination of the listeners: “*imagine a Sower going out to sow*”. In the imagery, Jesus tells how God “the Sower” distributes his graces in places that sound minded farmer would not dare to. Can you imagine scattering the precious seed on rocks or among thorns or on the edge of the path! These places would not favour crop germination, but to demonstrate God's generosity towards every person, he sometimes acts without counting the cost. Hardened hearts like a rock, competitive hearts like thorny bushes and unmindful hearts like seeds on the edge of the path are all touched by the grace of God.

The Parable is talking about me, it is talking about you, or it is talking about us. God is so generous to us irrespective of our attitude or of our standing before him. He expects us to bear fruits.

The fact that not every seed fell in rich soil from the start, reminds us that some of us will have to struggle in life before we reach the goal. Surely the seed that falls among thorns, has to struggle competing with them for light and for moisture. The seeds that falls on rocks, has to struggle to take root, and the seed that falls on the edge of the path, has to endure being trampled on by passers-by. Each one of us will have one thing or the other to struggle with before we bear fruits.

When Jesus used parables in his teaching, to some people, he simply sounded as a good story teller. There must have been people who waited for entertaining talk, just as some people on a Sunday morning Mass might think that a homily is an entertaining talk by the priest, yet most of us know that a priest is not a just a story teller, a political analyst or a football commentator but a teacher. If he gives a story as Jesus usually did, there is something he wants to teach. It might not be difficult to find some Christians who listen to homilies as stories.

In today's gospel, Jesus has a message for us to take home with. It is this: ask yourself “*if Jesus is the Sower, what kind of ground have I prepared of myself or of my family to receive his seed*”?

Today the Word of God is compared to seed that sprouts and brings forth new life. All of our life, entire creation is groaning in anticipation of being all we can become. Have you lost interest and zeal and now find yourself slowly drifting away from the fruitful practice of your faith?
