GOOD WERE OLD DAYS. DO NOT DO WHAT OTHERS DO THESE DAYS:

The readings this Sunday put us to task. They are talking about the golden rule but from another angle: 'treat others as you would like to be treated'.

Some of us were very lucky to be raised up at a time when people valued interpersonal relationships more than personal gain. At that time, the unity of family members was extremely important. Neighbours were concerned about the welfare of one another and the bringing up of children with good manners was a concern of every grown up. Peace and harmony mattered a lot since it was every person's concern. At that time, there was plenty of poverty everywhere but a lot of happiness and feeling of security. What we called going on as summer holiday, was probably to visit a neighbouring district for a week or two. We loved it. During those days, we did not decide what we wanted to eat, whatever food our parents put on the table, was eaten with gratitude for their hard work. We never longed to go and have a sleep over at our friends' homes to enjoy another taste of their food.

As children, we did not tell our parents what kind of toys we wanted to have, or which place we wanted to go for holidays. The decisions taken by those with authority meant much more than our personal inclinations. Children listened to the word of the parents not the other way round. In that kind of society, children played together in the streets, they walked to schools without fear or suspicion, and neighbours called on each other from their house windows! Those were good old days.

These days all this seem to be a fairy tale. If you entered a classroom and spoke to children about the world in which people of my age and above were brought up into, they might think that you are coming from another planet!

The world we live in today is closed to whatever made life meaningful and enjoyable in the past. There is more suspicion among people than trust. Some people have dedicated their life, to looking for opportunities for compensation to an extent of sacrificing good relationship and harmony in communities.

The readings of this Sunday are talking along these lines, challenging us to resist anger and the crave to treat other people in a way that we would not like to be treated. "He who exacts vengeance will experience the vengeance of the Lord. Forgive your neighbour the hurt he does you and when you pray, your sins will be forgiven" Eccl. 28:1-2. We are fortunate that we practice the faith, because when we attend Sunday Mass just as we have done today, Jesus gives us something to hold onto in our life. Seeking for compensation is good, but it can easily become unchristian.
