#### 'IT IS MARY THE MOTHER OF JESUS WHO TOLD US...'

The fourth Sunday brings us to meditate upon what I could call, the Gospel according to Mary. Unlike Easter, Christmas is centred on things that took place without independent witnesses except the person who tells the story. What we know about the public ministry of Jesus, his passion, his death and his resurrection were brought to us by the people who saw them happen, or who heard the word spoken, but the stories about the engagement between Mary and Joseph, the visit of the angel to Mary and Joseph and the discovery that Mary was carrying a baby in her womb, were private, what we know about them, must have been told by someone who was involved first hand: Mary. So, today and during the whole Christmas time, the Blessed Mother will speak to us, to help us to understand that Jesus is a special person

Among the many things she speaks to us today, is the integrity and respect of her husband Joseph. As a man set on marrying a girl by the name of Mariam, Joseph was not expecting to hear the story she was telling him. His family was in full swing preparing for his wedding to her, the villagers were aware that a wedding was unfolding. Things were moving on well, then the news broke, that the girl he was engaged to was pregnant. Joseph had many options at hand; he would have exposed her and have her publicly stoned to death, or he would himself bear public shame by taking home a wife who was unfaithful from the start. Joseph like Jesus chose to bear shame by taking the matter calmly.

This is where husbands and dad's in the homes need to ask themselves: 'How do I handle disappointing moments between me and my spouse'? Mary tells us today, that her husband Joseph was a man who commanded respect. What concept does your spouse have about you? Like Mary can she say, my husband is a man of honour, or he is someone ready to pounce on me, to make me feel small in public or who will not believe anything I tell him. The story Mary came up with, could hardly be believed but Joseph did.

Christmas puts men into the spotlight, just as the first Christmas did for Joseph. We honour him because he has something to teach us, namely that we should trust in God and trust others. When a man puts his trust in his wife, nothing can ruin his home or break up family. When spouses trust each other, children learn how to be honest and how to respect others.

As we approach Christmas let us learn from Joseph to be calm, and to listen to the full story before we go out of way. Family life will always demand that we trust in each other. Mary teaches wives and mothers in the home, to tell the truth no matter how hurtful it might be. She knew that Joseph would be hurt by her story, but there was no shortcut, or quick way out, she did not seek for an abortion, instead she was willing to bear shame and to risk her life.

I wish you all a blessed Christmas as it comes along. Let us celebrate it with simplicity and in purity of heart. Jesus is the person we honour during this time, take him home with you, speak about him to your children and neighbours. Love him with all your heart because he is our Emmanuel, God with us. Rejoice and be glad for he has saved us.
