#### GO TO THE LOST CHILDREN OF ISRAEL

I am writing this reflection from a parish I visited several years ago and I spoke about to you. Katovu Parish is found 70 miles along Masaka Mbarara Road as you travel towards Mbarara City. It was started by the Apostles of Jesus Missionaries some years ago. It is the place where I had a shower as my priest friend stood guard, to prevent people walking about to come to my direction. Things were very basic that time. I'm glad that there is much change, thanks to the commitment of the people and their priests. You know, if you take the parish to be your own spiritual home, you end up doing so many things to make you comfortable and easy enough to find your way to God.

I'm pleased to know that the parish is going on very well and that you are keeping an eye on one another. The reason I gave you that homework was to remind you of the responsibility we have towards each other. It is the very responsibility that Jesus speaks to us about in the gospel. In our Christian pilgrimage "we are vulnerable with so many temptations and lure worldly things, we can get lost at any time". All of us have stories to tell concerning our journey of faith. But Jesus gives us a mission to seek out the most vulnerable among us and pay greater attention to them.

In the gospel, Jesus chooses the apostles and sends them out. The mentioning of their names evokes the naming we received at baptism. The first question that our parents were asked upon present them for baptism was: "what name do you give to this child."? That was at our initial calling to become followers of Jesus. It means that as we hear him today calling his apostles, he called us too by name and, like them, he sent us out.

In Sacred scriptures, calling by name comes with a task to fulfil. When Jesus called and named his apostles, he gave them a task namely to deal with the most vulnerable the lost children of Israel. Vulnerability here does not refer to the handicapped or the physically infirm but it applied to the children of Abraham who had birth right claim to the promises made by Yahweh to him, and to his descendants, but had not accepted Jesus who had come as the fulfilment of those promises. Therefore, when Jesus tells his apostles to go to the lost children of Israel, he is referring to these, to make them accept Jesus, to make the sharers of the promises Yahweh had made to Abraham.

Putting this into context, looking at our parish, we soon realise that we are all vulnerable, we can easily go astray for one reason or the other. We also realise that there is so much work to be done in the Church which the Lord wanted me to do when he called me at baptism. The church will never run short of the need to evangelise or to be evangelize. Indeed the harvest is plentiful. If Jesus is telling us to go to the lost children of Israel, let us constantly be on the look out and try to find every early opportunity to help one another. It starts with a simple word 'hello' the rest follows as the Spirit of God guides us. I wish you success in the task of supporting one another in the work the Lord has given to us as members of St. Marys. The bottom line is "Go to the lost children of Israel."
