TALENTS AND MINISTRIES

Asking pupils in year six of a Coventry primary school, what they understood by the word 'talents', they answered: vocations, ministries, or services. Their answers were correct; talents are connected to the needs of our community. Today's Gospel reading (Mt. 25:14-30) is about inborn potentials in each person which culminate as expressions of services to the world. Our Lord's narrative confirms that we are embedded with several qualities or talents.

Our task is to consciously to develop them; an effort which requires humility, persistence, and hard work; but it is rewarding because it leads to self-actualization and high levels of self-esteem. The Gospel narrative shows that it does not matter how many talents one is given, what is important is that they are invested so that they multiply to benefit humanity.

Imagine the pride with which the achievers in the Gospel confessed to their master: 'Sir, you entrusted me with five talents; here are five more that I have made'; and similarly, the one who had received the two talents. On the contrary the one who received the one talent did nothing with it instead he buried it in the ground.

Well-developed talents bring joy to their owner, but they also enrich the community. This lesson is evident in the Book of Proverbs (Chapter 31) about the perfect housewife who is cause of joy to her husband, family, and neighbours. We are reaping from the wealth of talents of Saint Paul, the Apostle, who developed his gifts of preaching to the non-Jews. We are gaining from his spirit of prayer and attentive listening to God. His writings are a huge resource for reflecting about the day of the Lord, which will come as a thief in the night, so we need to be ever prepared to meet the Lord.

Talents are closely associated with the needs of the community. In his providence God gives us a variety of gifts so that his people will be taken care of. Certain sectors during this century require specialized talents to address the greatest trials of humanity: destructive wars, the human-caused environmental devastation, extreme poverty particularly in third world countries, and the dangers of individualism, secularism, and materialism.

These times need peace makers, conciliators, mentors in contemplation, and self-esteem: talents required today. These and others call for an attentive heart to identify and develop them in our self-actualization so as to benefit our Church, our country and the rest of the world.

Dear Brothers and Sisters, have you discovered your talents? How are you using them to serve other people?
