RE-EXAMINE YOUR SELF OR YOU MIGHT NOT BE GENUINE

In the eight days that follow Easter, the Church gives to us a lesson about Faith which is the foundation of all spiritual life. It is as if Mother Church were saying to us her children, "True, the Lord is risen, but that will only benefit you in proportion to your faith".

Last Sunday we learned that the apostle Thomas was lacking in his faith, he wanted to see, to feel, to verify. The crucifixion was so gruesome that to believe that the crushed Lord had come back to life, was unthinkable. It is hard to be certain why he refused to believe the testimony of the other apostles, men he knew well that they were not dishonest. In any case, there was something in his heart that prevented him from making an act of faith in the resurrection.

This reminds us that faith is a gift of God, it is not something that can be produced simply by will-power or by reasoning, however intelligent a person may be - it remains a gift of God, and like all the greatest gifts of God, faith is given not to the proud but to the humble.

For those who do not believe, Thomas seems to be their favourite but that was him before meeting the risen Lord because after having the personal encounter with Christ, he gave to the community a magnificent act of faith in Jesus by calling him Lord and God. Thomas saw the risen Christ, but believed in his divinity.

In today's gospel Jesus appears to his disciples in another form. These different forms were meant to help their minds to experience him in different forms so that they may understand that it was him indeed. Jesus goes further to challenge the three times denial of Simon Peter that he knew him by asking him whether he loved him. While Peter's first and second response came without thought, the third response required careful reflection.

As you return home today, I ask you to re-examine the claim we make that we love Jesus, that we love the Church or one another. We must be genuine and honest but not pay lip service, but we must never be over confident, because at the end of the day, it is Jesus himself who knows whether and how much we love him. MATTERS OF IMPORTANCE

<u>Warm welcome to Fr Peter Prusakiewicz CSMA</u> a renowned Polish preacher on Divine Mercy accompanied by Ms. Noreen Bewster who coordinates his travels. Fr. Peter is here with us today to preach about the Mercy of the Lord at both Masses 9.30am and 11.30am.

Divine Mercy Sunday : Thank you all for coming to celebrate the mercy of God last Sunday. Let us always and every where proclaim His love and mercy for He is merciful.

Bequest to St. Mary's: Late Peggy Hyland a devout parishner of St. Mary's left in her will £1000 for her beloved parish where she always received spiritual strength and consolation. I express my gratefulness to Peggy Hyland and her family for the bequest given to the parish.

<u>Mary Byrne RIP</u> another parishioner left for the parish of St Mary and St Benedict £1,000 for general purposes and £10,000 for what is described in Mary's will as Our Lady of Lourdes care of St Mary and St Benedict Roman Catholic Church. This £10,000 will need to be used to restart that fund, which will also need to be kept as a restricted fund.

<u>Would you like to share your faith</u> with others by teaching Catechism? Catechesis is a ministry of teaching and forming that passes on the Word of God to inform the Catholic community and candidates for initiation into the Church about the teachings of Christ, transmitted by the Apostles to the Church.

The Month of Mary which we have began is dedicated to the Blessed Mother. Pope Francis invites Catholics and Marian Shrines around the world to dedicate this month by holding a marathon of prayer for an end to the Covid-19 pandemic. The initiative, behind which the Pope has thrown his support, involves 30 Marian Shrines from various parts of the world. It takes place under the theme "The whole Church was fervently praying to God," which recalls a verse in the Book of Acts (12:5).

<u>Gift Aid is a scheme</u> that allows charities to reclaim tax on a donation made by a UK taxpayer, which means that the parish can claim back from the HMRC 25p for every £1 you donate. A Gift can be made to the parish at any time. Such a Gift can be used at the discretion of the parish or restricted as directed by the donor.

Toilet repairs: I'm sorry to observe again that parish property is not handled with care, this is especially noticed in the parish toilet chambers where toilets are broken from time to time. The parish spent $\pounds 1,140.00$ this week to put new ones, you can imagine how much we shall spend if we have to replace them every two months or less! This abuse is so common in the ladies side.

<u>Cleaners</u> we need volunteers to help us clean our church every Saturday morning from 07:30 -09:30 am. Please give some of your time, it gives joy to the rest of the community.

Vocations Sunday: The Fourth Sunday of Easter is known as **Vocations Sunday** or **Good Shepherd Sunday**, and is marked as the **World Day of Prayer for Vocations**. The purpose of this day is to fulfil Jesus' instruction to "*Pray the Lord of the harvest to send labourers into his harvest*" (Matthew 9:38). While appreciating all vocations, the Church concentrates her attention on raising up shepherds for God's people - vocations to Holy Orders (the priesthood and diaconate) and to the religious life - while encouraging all who are discerning their vocation to pray more earnestly that they may hear and respond to God's call.

<u>Pope's prayer Intention for May</u>: we pray for all young people, called to live life to the fullest; may they see in Mary's life the way to listen, the depth of discernment the courage that faith generates and the dedication to service.
