Twenty-Second Sunday in ordinary time- Parish Newsletter- 1st to 8th Sept. ALTHOUGH WE WORRY TOO MUCH IT IS GOD WHO SUSTAINS THEM

The path of parenthood is very hard indeed, it is full of worries from the start to the end. Families free of worries are non existent, what makes the difference is the way how they interpret their experiences. A family which looks at events in its life as another piece of the jigsaw without which the picture would not be complete is likely to be at peace while one which looks at every event as another tragedy will live a miserable life.

Last Tuesday the church celebrated the memorial of St. Monica, the mother of St. Augustine. It is not common mother and son to be recognised saints. What makes Monica unique is that the salvation of her family was her singular goal and she never relented in her efforts to make that happen.

When a child is born there are many things parents worry about; the basic one at that stage being health and safety. As the child grows up, they worry about his/her education. Teenage years are troublesome to every responsible parent, some strings have to be loosened while others have to be held tight. It is at this time that every parent proves who he/she is.

Once the child leaves home to go to College or to the University the parents worry about the kind of company he/she might keep. When the university is done, they worry about the job prospects, for, every parent feels happy to see their child in work. But it does not take long before they worry about permanent stable relationship for their son or daughter. Unless someone is intent on becoming a priest or a religious, no parent is comfortable to see his/her child without a family he/she can call his own. As time passes new tittles are acquired: dad turns into grand dad, mum becomes grand ma, but the parents still carry worries about what will happen to their children when they are gone.

As you can notice, there are a lot of things that go on in our families which we need to pray for and to thank God for whether your family is on the rocks or not. A Parish Family Thanksgiving day is an opportunity to celebrate our togetherness as a family. God himself has set up these families for us in his infinite providence. It is his plan!

At one time Jesus cured ten men of their leprosy, one of them finding himself cured *he* went back threw *himself* at Jesus' feet and *thanked Him.* - Luke 17:15 . The nine continued home not realising that their cure was by God's help. Finding our families and all the blessings God has given and the trials they go through let us come together and pray for them that God may bless, sanctify and sustain them now and for ever.

YOU ARE MOST WELCOME to our Parish Church. If it is your first time here or probably you have been here before, your presence with us at this moment at our community worship is greatly appreciated. Our Parish Church is the second to be built in Coventry after the Protestant Reformation. It was built in 1893, the pews have never moved since then!
