Be united in your convictions

Unity is a quality of living which is sought by many people. Founders and builders of African nations were able to throw away the yoke of colonialism because they were united in purpose and united in their conviction that colonialism was evil. They attacked it from every angle, even though their love for each other was not that strong. Unity can win battles. Dictators are fully aware how dangerous it can be for them, when people under their oppression get united. Therefore they create conditions that would make unity impossible. It is not difficult for example to find people who claim to be members of the opposition party, while as a matter of fact they are agents working for the dictator (moles within)! We can say that Unity is fought against, just as much as it is sought.

The Word of God speaks to us about the need to be united in action and in purpose. The Christian people of Philippi like the Corinthians had self seeking ambitions. Each group was tempted to hold on its territory such that new volunteers were taken as interference. St. Paul as founder of the Church at Philippi, was quick to warn the Christians of the danger of trying told on their individual territories instead of opening up to work together for the building of the body of Christ- the Church.

The coming of Covid19, exposed some bad practices within some parishes that has left deep impact. Those churches where parishioners adamantly held on their small territories, have not recovered since the pandemic, while those parishes where their members worked together, where nobody thought of his/her interest first, and valued the contribution of one another, returned to normality as soon as the lockdown ended.

Parish building, requires that their members value every service that each person and each group offers. Every hand is valuable in baking our cake, therefore the saying that "many cooks spoil the broth" does not apply when it comes to building parish community. I have been so blessed in my priestly ministry to be surrounded by people who play their parts so well, such that I have constantly seen the Holy Spirit at work in every corner.

Let us spend some time this week to put into our life the teaching of St. Paul to the Philippians: "There must be no competition among you, no conceit; but every body is to be self effacing. Always consider the other person to be better than yourself, so that nobody thinks of his own interests first, but everybody thinks of other peoples interests instead."
