GOD NEVER TAKES BACK HIS GIFT OR REVOKE HIS CHOICE

I'm sure that playing a deaf ear, is one of those things that all of us have done as we grow up. I have come across small children where mom or dad calls again and again, and the child pretends not to have heard. I think it is because of the sin of Adam that this affects all of us.

When a grown up person is called by another, and that person refuses to respond, it shows lack of respect. Today Jesus plays a deaf ear to the pleading of a Canaanite woman. We can say that he behaved badly towards her. She had a daughter who was very sick. She had heard about Jesus, She came with trust that he would help her but he did not pay attention to her. The more she called on Jesus the Healer for help, the more he pretended not to have heard! The disciples were fed up by the noise, 'Jesus give her what she wants so that she can leave us in peace.' Now, there is an important lesson here. Prayer is a serious commitment, it requires perseverance and persistence. Prayer is not a casual activity or something that we do when we feel like, but it is something we must do.

Prayer should express our deep faith and gratitude to God. The encounter between Jesus and the woman was not as you can meet someone shouting on the road, instead this woman followed Jesus for some distance, pleading and interceding for her daughter. She did not give up because only Jesus had the answer to her troubles.

In the second reading, we have heard that inspiring statement: "God never takes back his gifts nor revoke his choice". This being the case, why do we get discouraged so easily and give up following the Lord along the road calling on him, because we believe, that He will not take from us what he meant for us, even when he delays to give an answer! God listens to our prayers, and gives to us what we ask of him.

God never takes back his gifts nor revoke his choice, if something is meant for you, no one will take it from you. God is faithful, God has a plan, God wants us to have deep faith, even though his silence might cause us anxiety.

The first reading has reminded us that God listens to the prayers and accepts the gifts of all people. We are many, all saying the same words or singing the same hymns but God receives our prayers individually. He is not disturbed or confused by the noise. Because his house is a house of prayer for all peoples, not for some, but for all peoples.

As you return home today, let us persevere in prayer, even when what we are asking for is not forth coming, let us persist because *God never takes back his gift or revoke his choice*.
