WHAT IS YOUR VOCATION?

Today's liturgy is drawing our attention to a striking title of our risen Lord, the Good Shepherd, which harmonises with the themes of Vocations Sunday. We therefore ask in what ways God is calling us to serve him in the Church today?

By virtue of the Sacrament of Baptism, every Christian has the vocation to share in the ministry of our Lord: the priest, prophet, and king. St Peter affirms these roles when he says '... you are a chosen race, a royal priesthood, a holy nation, a people of his own, so that you may announce the praises of him who called you out of darkness into his wonderful light' (1Pt. 2:9). This sense of identity has significant implications as we go about our lives and minister to each other. Basically, as Christians, and above all Catholics, we each share in our Lord's ministries of shepherding in the world.

Special ministries: I am inviting our young people to look at the various ways the Lord may be inviting them to spend their lives as they respond to the needs of the Church. I believe that the Lord continues to call some to embrace the sacred priesthood, monastic life, religious life, and missionary life in the various Institutes of Consecrated Life.

Vocation Evolves with Ministries: There are adults who embraced the vocation to marriage and family life but who the Lord is calling to serve as permanent deacons, extraordinary eucharistic ministers, lectors, catechists, and members of pastoral councils, to promote the kingdom of God in our times.

Discernment: The process of finding one's particular vocation, and ways of ministering in the Church, requires an honest self-examination before the Lord in prayer, and an availability to the assessment of the Church leaders through whom the Lord communicates his will. This means that a vocational journey is one of faith because it entails personal surrender to God in the generous availability to the people that need our time and efforts.

May the Lord, the Good Shepherd, inspire us to discover the ways in which he wishes us to serve him in the Church today. Amen.
