WE ARE TAKEN FROM THE WORLD BY THE FATHER

The long Priestly prayer of Jesus, part of which we have heard in the gospel, is a personal account to his heavenly Father that he gives at the conclusion of his work. In this first part, Jesus has spoken about himself and how he carried out the mission on earth. A community of believers had been formed. The Father's name has been known, and his glory passed on to those who believe in him. When Jesus finished his mission he said "I'm coming to you".

The second part of this Priestly prayer which we shall listen to throughout the week, will speak to us about the kind of life that Jesus wants us to live, namely that we love one another and keep united as children of God, and as members of his family the church.

The Gospel reminds us that God has given us a mission to do in this life. Of course when we are born we are not born with it, it is something that we work on everyday, only to be discovered at the end of our life. For some of us, we might depart this life without knowing the exact mission that I had. As St. John Henry Newman says, 'this one, we shall be told when we come before God.'

Jesus speaks of the choice he has personally made by choosing us to become Christians "I have made your name known to the men you took from the world to give me, they were yours, and you gave them to me." This reminds us that we are not Christians by personal will, instead we are chosen by God himself. Indeed as one of the Prefaces of the Mass says: we are a chosen race, a holy nation, a people consecrated to God. So, when the Church asks us to take our faith in God seriously, it is because she has been taught by the Lord himself that the Father has taken us from the world and we belong to Jesus our Good Shepherd. Jesus belongs to God, we too belong to God.

The gospel today, gives us a sense of pride, that although we are like all other people, by believing in Jesus Christ, we have hidden value, a heavenly dignity bestowed on us.

The first reading teaches us that continuous prayer is one of the means by which we can nurture our unity as a chosen people of God. A family that prays together and eats together, will always live together. The first Christians prayed continually for each other, for their welfare and for the needs of the community. We are also reminded of the presence of Mary. When we gather to pray, the Blessed Mother is with us, just as she was with the disciples, she intercedes for us and she presents our prayers to her son.

The second reading teaches us that as followers of Jesus, we shall sometimes be subjected to punishment and sufferings for offences we have not committed. But if you can have some share in the suffering of Christ, be glad in otherwards we should not feel at loss to suffer for a good cause.

As you return home, let us go with confidence that God is with us because he loves us. Like the Psalmist, we too are sure that we shall see the Lord's goodness in the land of the living on the Day of Mercy.

Gospel Reflection

In commenting upon this passage, Saint Augustine notes that this prayer is prayed immediately after Jesus told His disciples that they would encounter trouble within the world. "In the world you will have trouble, but take courage, I have conquered the world." For that reason, Jesus set an example for us on how we are to deal with the troubles we encounter in life. We, too, must turn our eyes to Heaven and pray to the Father. The best way to do so is by our full interior participation in the Holy Mass.

What form of "trouble" do you experience right now in your life? There are many things that fall into that category and are different for each person. As you call your struggle to mind, try to imagine our Lord kneeling next to you, praying this prayer to the Father for you. In reality, this is exactly what Jesus does every time we participate in the Holy Mass. The Mass is His "hour."
