THE NATIVITY STORY IS A GOSPEL AS PREACHED BY MARY

We have entered the second and final part of Advent, whatever plans and preparations we are making, are at their advanced stage because Christmas will soon be here. The world is excited, business stores are fully stoked, our roads are again busy with fast moving vehicles; why—It is Christmas!

The incarnation of Jesus, his childhood and parental care were not known until he started to preach after he was baptised by John the Baptist in the River Jordan. His first potential followers cynically dismissed Nazareth the village where he was brought up as a place where nothing good was thought to come forth ((Jn. 1:45-47)! Although the Twelve Apostles were close to him, they constantly asked themselves with amazement: who he could be (Matt 8:27)! It did not take long before the Pharisees and temple officials in Jerusalem questioned his authority.

The four Gospels present us with detailed report of the teaching of Jesus of his miracles and of the conspiracy among the Jewish leaders that led to his crucifixion and death on the cross; but only two speak to us about how he was conceived, the confusion of his mother since she was already promised in marriage to Joseph, the resignation of Joseph to the message of the angel and all that happened after he was born at Bethlehem. The appearance of the angel Gabriel to Mary and Joseph took place separately and in private, so where did the stories come from?

There is no doubt to believe with certainty that the details about the conception of Jesus, the visitation of the Angel Gabriel to Joseph and all other stories we read about the baby Jesus until the time when he appeared on the River Jordan where he was baptised by John, are based on what Mary his mother told the early Christians possibly after Pentecost when Christianity took a definite shape.

Christmas stories are much about Jesus as they are about Mary. The story of Christmas s a story of Mary as she taught it. She bids us to hold in belief what happened away from public gaze. Without Mary we have no explanation for the source of the story that cheers the whole world as the story of Christmas.

YOU ARE MOST WELCOME to our Parish Church. If it is your first time here or probably you have been here before, your presence with us at this moment at our community worship is greatly appreciated. Our Parish Church is the second to be built in Coventry after the Protestant Reformation. It was built in 1893, the pews have never moved since then! Our Musical Pipe Organ was inaugurated in 1898, it was the best of its kind at the time. Our Parish has had eleven Parish priests since 1889, the present one being a Religious Missionary from the Institute of Apostles of Jesus in Uganda. Our Parish welcomes and promotes the initiatives taken by everyone for the building up and sustenance of our faith community.
