WITH JESUS ON A HIGH MOUNTAIN

On this second Sunday of Lent, Our Lord is inviting us to go with him to the top of a high mountain. There alone with him, he will teach us to meaningfully spend this year's Lenten Season. We shall deepen in our lives the three pillars of Lent, namely: Prayer, Fasting and Almsgiving (Charity). Let us reflect on the rich symbolism of 'a high mountain' in our spiritual life.

I have been blessed in my lifetime to have been close to several high mountains in Africa and the Middle East: Moroto, Muhabura, Masaba, Kenya, Kilimanjaro, the Rwenzoris and Horeb (Sinai). Because of their height and conditions of the wild, they are not humanly habitable; thus, the higher the mountain, the more it is deserted. High mountains therefore hold with them a sense of mystery, and there is no wonder that many communities have held them as centres of worship. High mountains carry an aura of silence while providing a suitable environment for prayer, meditation, contemplation, and union with God.

We can understand why God instructed Abraham to sacrifice his only child, Isaac, on a high mountain in the land of Moriah (Genesis, 22:2). Today's Gospel extract presents Jesus taking three of his disciples to a high mountain to be transfigured in their presence.

The season of Lent presents us with a refreshing invitation to depart from the noise of our busy schedules in the city and village, and acknowledge of our emotional and spiritual turbulence and seek union with God on a high mountain. In this sense the expression *'high mountain'* is used figuratively to symbolise a seclusion that encourages meaningful experiences prayer.

It is in moments of prayer that we present ourselves to God as we are and offer him our natural inclinations and their manifestations: pride; selfishness; and the idols of sexual lust, anger, unworthy attachments, and indifference. There, we experience the overwhelming peace that comes from God's forgiveness. We therefore exclaim with Peter, 'Rabbi, it is wonderful for us to be here; so let us make three tents, one for You, one for Moses and one for Elijah' (Mark, 9:5). During this Lenten Season, let us keep close to our Lord Jesus Christ; let us contemplate his face in our neighbours, particularly the most vulnerable who need our kindness.

I wish you a great week of blessings and joy in the Lord.
